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## HOPKINS PLANS TO GET RULING BY PRESIDENT

Washington, Dec. 13 (AP)—President Roosevelt is to rule soon on Harry L. Hopkins' plan for the expenditure of a billion dollars or more on federal unemployment relief activities. Hopkins, relief chief, has completed a program calling for that sum outside of public works or farm relief. He said he would give it to the president shortly.  
 A major purpose is to continue direct relief through the winter and indefinitely into the summer, officials doubting that the feeding-clothing burden can be transferred back to the states for another year or more.
