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ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS By Frederic J. Haskin

Q. What is the new dance called Nira? C.S. A. Dancing Masters of America, Incorporated, adopted the NIRA code, and named a dance for it. "The steps can be danced to any rhythm. The Gentleman's part: Four slow walking steps, left right, left right, step forward left, step close, step close, short steps to right side. Step forward, right one long step, step close, step close to left side. Walk forward left right left, step close to right. Turn forward, on left making a half turn left, back on heel as in tango, step forward right foot, close left foot to right foot. Step as in Spanish, bridge turn to right."

Q. When was speed Holman killed in an airplane accident? A.M. A. C. W. Holman, operations manager for the Northwest Airways, was killed on May 17, 1931, while participating in the Omaha Air Races.

Q. Where is the Sunshine Highway? H.T. A. This highway, the only international project of its size east of the Rocky Mountains, connects Alberta's extensive highway system with that of the States of Montana, Nevada, and California, making an attractive scenic route along the eastern side of the Rockies from the Peace River District in North-

ern Alberta to San Diego, California, on the south, a distance of more than 2,500 miles.

Q. How many distilleries were in operation in the United States before Prohibition, and how many are there now? D.P. A. In 1917 there were 507 distilleries in operation in the United States; in 1918 there were 235; and in 1919 there were 74. In 1922 there were 71 distilleries in operation in the United States. In 1918 there were 178, \$33,799.1 tax gallons of distilled spirits produced; in 1922 there were 150,390,594.9 tax gallons produced.

Q. Please give birth dates of Gen. Hugh Johnson, Senator Huey Long, Prof. Raymond Moley, and Elliott Roosevelt. J.W.T. A. General Johnson August 3, 1882; Senator Long, August 30, 1893; Prof. Moley, September 27, 1888; Elliott Roosevelt, September 16, 1911.

Q. Is Madame Schumann-Heink a Jew? H.A.E. A. She had a grandmother who was a Jewess. Her other ancestors were Gentiles, and Madame Schumann-Heink, herself, is a Catholic.

Q. What is the natural color of rubber? C.M.H. A. Its natural color is grayish-white.

Q. Why does a shark turn on its back to attack an object? C.H.G. A. Because of the peculiar conformation of a shark's mouth, it is necessary for it to turn on its back when attacking an object at the surface of the water. A shark's mouth opens below its snout on the underside of its body, and it is,

therefore, unable to bite anything directly above it without turning over.

Q. How much money was in hoarding when the situation was considered acute? H.P. A. It is estimated that between \$1,500,000,000 and \$2,000,000,000 was withdrawn from active circulation for hoarding.

Q. What is the product made from cornstarch? A.J.H. It is called maltodextrin, and has been used on a small scale in the manufacture of the following articles: nutmegs, gums, rotes, tubs, refillable fuses, rinzinatics, wheels bearings, screws and nuts.

Q. How many persons listed in Who's Who give their religious affiliations? N.S. A. In the 1930-31 edition, 16,629 persons gave their religious affiliations, while 12,592 did not.

Q. What is meant by a nine-foot channel in a river? Is it breadth or depth? W.K. A. It indicates the depth.

Q. What is the probable age of a sugar maple tree six feet in diameter? E.W.V. A. An open grown maple of the type mentioned might be 250 to 350 years old. On the other hand, forest grown maple trees of this type sometimes reach only 20 inches in diameter in 180 years.

Q. What was the first series of poems published by Lord Byron called? J.T. A. Hours of Idleness, in 1807. Several criticisms in the Edinburgh Review brought forth the satire, English Bards and Scotch Reviewers, in 1809.

Q. When was the American Stores company organized? L.W. A. The initial organization in the chain was the Childs company, which was established in 1883. The American Stores company was incorporated in 1917.
