RED CROSS TO START COURSES IN SWIMMING

Interest is being aroused in Salem and vicinity by the announcement of the opening of the new Olinger field swimming pool and the beginning of the Red Cross swimming and life saving courses on Monday, June 18.

The swimming courses will continue until Wednesday, June 27 under the direction of Jean Eberhart, a swimming expert from the national Red Cross office. Both children and adults are eligible for these classes and are urged to register as soon as possible at the Red Cross office, 248 1/2 North Commercial street, or with Willard Marshall, Physicians and Surgeons office at High and Ferry streets.

The courses will be for both beginners and advanced swimmers and instruction in first aid will also be given. Certificates will be issued for life saving and pins will be given to those taking the swimming courses. There will be no charge for registration fee. Spectators may attend without charge.

The new pool at Olinger field has been under construction for several months and it was expected that work would be turned into it for the first time Wednesday afternoon. Dressing rooms adjacent to the pool have also been completed. Red Cross nurses will be on hand during the entire "learn to swim" week.

Judge George Rossmann, who is in charge of the plans for the local campaign, announces that life saving will be emphasized, with special stress upon the technique of rescue and resuscitation.

Freak Alfalfa Plant Studied By Scientists

Morgantown, W. Va. (AP)—A freak variety of alfalfa, found on the farm of Charles G. Ashton, near Moundsville, is being studied here by Russell B. Gist of the University of West Virginia.

The unusual plant sends down a root rather than other varieties and each stalk has its own roots. The Ashton plant has one main root, plus an extensive root system from which 308 stalks were growing.

As alfalfa enriches soil by charging it with nitrogen Ashton believes such a spreading root system would aid greatly in soil up-building.
