

AGRICULTURAL NOTES PENNED ABOUT COUNTY

Dallas — Ordinarily Polk county farmers don't grow very large fields of potatoes but A. F. Elkins & Sons of the Helmick park district are planting 115 acres of the Garnet variety of potatoes this year. This is a comparatively new variety that is generally sold to the California markets for seed purposes.

Ralph Kester of the Silver district is one of the few dairymen of this county that cuts his hay before putting it into the mow. Mr. Kester reports that he finds it just as easy to cut it in as pulling it in with a hay fork. Like most other farmers, Mr. Kester has a fine hay rack that will tax the capacity of his barn.

A large new barn is being built on the J. H. Mulkey estate north of Monmouth. This farm is operated by W. Ray Adams.

Ernest Ziesch of the Parker district has planted a field of Ladino clover which he plans on irrigating with water from the Luckiamute. Mr. Ziesch already has an underground pipe system installed with which to carry the water to the field. This is the first large piece of Ladino clover in that part of Polk county.

An interesting experiment is being carried on by Felix Conroy of the Ferriday district. Mr. Conroy is irrigating red clover for the purpose of trying to increase the seed yield. A heavy hay crop was cut off of the land later than it would ordinarily be cut. Following this the ground was watered.

J. D. Ediger who lives on the highway east of Dallas has found that an application of lime rock made in 1929 has enabled him to grow a fine crop of vetch every year since. This year Mr. Ediger harvested a hay crop of about three tons per acre. According to Mr. Ediger he had been unable to grow vetch on that particular land until he limed it.

FLORIDA ENJOYS BUILDING BOOM

Miami, Fla. (AP)—Florida in 1934 is enjoying the greatest racket it's had in years. It's the hammering, rattling noise of building activity, splitting the ear-drums again after having dwindled off into silence in the great empty echo of the depression.

With a total of \$23,851,200 worth of new construction contracts let in the first four months of 1934, compared to \$2,373,000 for the corresponding period of 1933, all classes of Florida's construction have increased 607.1 per cent in volume, according to figures of the F. W. Dodge Building Survey.

Private construction, including contracts for new homes, office buildings, garages and stores to cost \$5,509,900, is summarized in a survey just completed by a committee of Florida newspaper publishers who sponsored a recent state-wide celebration honoring Col. Henry L. Doherty of New York whom Floridians regard as having played a big role in the state's 1934 prosperity.

The \$5,509,900 figure, for the first four months of 1934, represents a gain of 193.2 per cent over the same period of 1933, when \$1,846,700 was reported.

Figures compiled by the committee revealed that the greatest single gain was 480 per cent, recorded in
