PUBLIC ASKED TO RECEPTION QUELLE CAFE

Residents of Salem and the entire trading public of this part of the Willamette valley will be welcomed tonight at the Quelle, Salem's latest acquisition in the restaurant industry. This elaborately remodeled establishment, which takes the place of the former Gray Belle, 440 State street, is to be reopened by Frank H. Chatas, who comes to Salem after 16 years of successful restaurant operation at Pendleton.

Open house hours will be from 7:30 to 9:30 o'clock, and free refreshments will be served during that period. Preparations are being completed today for one of the largest crowds that has ever attended the formal opening of a place of business in Salem. The Quelle will open for business at 6 o'clock Thursday morning.

Mr. Chatas, in remodeling, redecorating and reequipping the restaurant has spared no expense. Among improvements is the installation of an air-conditioning system on the main floor which will maintain a constant supply of fresh air, at the same time keeping the dining rooms and booths warm in winter and cool in the summer. The better ventilation extends to the spacious basement banquet room which, as under the former management, will be known as the Silver Grill.

For the benefit of those who like to have a quick meal and at the same time a comfortable one a long lunch counter with rotating chairs has been installed along the right from the State street entrance. Here

also is the fountain, better equipped than ever before. At the left of the wide aisle booths have been rebuilt with cushioned seats, and there is a similar arrangement of booths towards the rear of the main floor. A door in the left wall is the entrance, on this floor, to a dining and banquet room without booths.

At the extreme rear is the newly equipped kitchen, all the furnishings being of the newest design. Included are steam tables to assure food served at the proper temperature, refrigerated tables to keep salads in tasty condition, and for purpose of sanitation the floor is of tile. For the Silver Grill an auxiliary serving kitchen has been installed.

Wood work has been painted a cream color with modernistic red and black designs. Wall paper is of attractive and cheerful motif.

As for service Mr. Chatas believes he will have the best, for there will be enough waitresses to meet with dispatch the desires of the patrons. In short, says Mr. Chatas, a type of restaurant service has been developed that will please the customers. This provision comes as a result of Mr. Chatas' long experience.

Quartet To Sing

ROME POLICE NOW ENFORCE TRAFFIC LAW

Rome, (AP)—"Stop! Draw up to the curb. You're fined 25 lire for the violation of traffic rule No. 30, so and so. Here's your receipt." This is the greeting of the Italian policeman when a motorist goes against the traffic light, or violates any traffic rule.

Any metropolitan, Italian traffic policeman, has the right to arrest you, judge you, fine you, collect the money on the spot, without having to resort to the police court.

This summary justice has been in use nearly four years and has proved efficacious. Any violator, however, has the right to refuse to pay and go to court.

This system has its advantages as well as its abuses. It relieves court expenses in petty traffic cases. However, it gives the policeman powers which in many countries he is not capable of exercising.

Severe punishment is inflicted on a policeman, however, if he makes a mistake and hence they are cautious in all their actions.

Out of the 22,487 fines in 1933 in Rome alone, there were six appeals. Perhaps the reason for lack of protest is the annoyance for appearance.

Most people are willing to pay the ten or 25 lire fine and escape the trouble of having to protest or appear at court. Another reason is that if payment is not made at once and the offender is still found guilty at the court or police station, he must pay a double fine.
