VETERAN NEWS MAN TALKS TO COUNCIL

A reminiscent speech was made before the city council last night by Frank Davey, who as a newspaperman, attended the first council meeting ever held in the present city hall. The city hall, he said, is a monument to the late Frank B. Southwick, who constructed the building, and Mr. Davey stressed the durability and general excellence of the work. Mr. Davey mentioned the verbal battles that occurred in former days between mayors and aldermen. Notwithstanding their political differences they put the interests of the city first, he said, and accomplished much for Salem. He spoke of clashes that occurred, among others, between Claud Gatch, as mayor, and John H. Albert, as alderman, and later between Albert and J. J. Murphy as mayor. "As a newspaper reporter," said Mr. Davey, "I had to write the proceedings in long hand and was expected to have it ready for the printer when a council meeting adjourned."
