

SYMPHONY TO PLAY IN BOWL AT BIG SHOW

A dash of color will be sprinkled over the Ford Bowl when orange and blue awnings are installed in the shell and the same colored seat backs are used in the bowl, where the Portland Symphony orchestra and other coast orchestras will appear during the San Diego exposition this summer. Three acoustical experts, among them Alfred Hertz, conductor of the San Francisco Symphony orchestra, have been studying the effects of the temporary awning for the past three days.

It was the unanimous opinion of acoustical engineers that sunshades improved the sound effects in the Bowl. Hertz sat in the Bowl for four hours Tuesday evening during an entire concert and a rehearsal and announced the awning had considerably improved the tone of the orchestra.

The awnings will be of burnt orange with blue valances. Decorators assert this will break up the glare of the white shell and brighten up the entire Ford Bowl. The improvements are being installed under the direction of Richard S. Requa, exposition architect and engineer.

Backs for the seats will also be orange and blue and will be grouped in sections, alternately. They will be made of wood and will be tied to the seats with iron straps, added to their comfort by the springiness of the metal supports.

For the first time since the opening of America's exposition, colored lights were used in the Bowl shell Tuesday during the evening concert. The blended lights will be used every evening during the balance of the symphony season.

The short road behind the Bowl which branches off from the 11th street entrance road by the electric substation has been ordered paved to reduce the dust.

A nine foot wall on the road level in front of the Bowl will be completed before the end of this week. This wall will be decorative and will add much to the comfort of bowl visitors by eliminating the conversation of those passing on the sidewalk while concerts are underway.

Arrangements have been completed for wiring the Ford Bowl public address system with the Firestone singing fountain loudspeakers. In the future music lovers may hear the symphony or organ music from the Bowl through the speakers while sitting around the fountain and those in the Bowl will not be annoyed by conflicting music from the speakers while concerts are in progress.

Park Highways To Crater Are Opened

Crater Lake National Park, Ore., June 13—Park highways to the rim of Crater lake were opened to two-way traffic this week, following several weeks of snow removal efforts. While snow is melting rapidly in the rim area, it is still over six feet deep, recalling one of the most severe winters in several seasons. Ample parking space has been provided for automobiles and snow banks. Snow removal crews have also cleared the road from the cafeteria to the Crater lake lodge in preparation for its opening June 15. With this show cleared away, efforts will be started immediately on the opening of the east entrance from The Dalles-California highway. This project will undoubtedly be completed before the end of this month.

BONNEVILLE DAM JOB IS RESUMED

Portland, June 13 (AP)—Work on Bonneville dam on the Columbia river was resumed yesterday after the Northwestern Electric's new overhead transmission line from the Washington side to Bradford station, was put into operation shortly before noon.

The submarine cable snapped late Saturday, markedly curtailing work on the project. Employees returned from their "vacations" yesterday afternoon. About 500 men were idle as a result of the mishap. Three hundred others did not stop work.

TWO MORE TOWNS COME INTO BEING

Bonneville, Ore., June 13 (AP)—Two more towns, one in Oregon and one in Washington, had been incorporated yesterday as a result of the influx of residents into this area for the construction of the \$32,000,000 Bonneville dam.

By a vote of 79 to 74, North Bonneville, Wash., Tuesday elected to become a municipality and chose William Brice as mayor. An incorporation vote at Cascade Locks, Ore., Tuesday carried by a majority of 38 votes. Spirited campaigns preceded both ballots.

BAD FOR DRIVERS

GOOS BAY TO HAVE BENEFIT OF BILL

Portland, Ore., June 13 (AP)—Senator McNary yesterday secured approval by the senate commerce committee of amendments to the river and harbor bill which would affect the Goos Bay district, according to the Journal.

The amendments would: Authorize modification of the Goos Bay project by increasing the channel width between Pigeon reef and Smith's mill from 250 feet to 400 feet at the bridge, 300 feet in front of North Bend and Marshfield and to provide a turning basin 500 by 1,000 feet at the estimated cost of \$184,000.

Authorize the Coquille river project at 13 feet between the open sea and the east end of the north jetty, costing \$30,000 annually for maintenance.

Provide surveys looking toward improvement of Skipanon river, Westport slough, Fort Orford harbor, and Coos Bay river and tributaries, the latter for control of flood and soil erosion. The river and harbor bill, first in several years, has passed the house and is being shaped for final action in the senate.
