

SALES TAX IS PREDICTED IN NEAR FUTURE

Oregonians will be paying a sales tax in the next few years.

Oregon, surrounded by sales tax states—Washington, Idaho and California—is going to find the twice-rejected levy inevitable, close followers of political and governmental affairs predict.

A good revenue producer, the sales tax may even bob up at the special session of the legislature which will be called in the next six months to build a new \$3,500,000 state capitol building to replace the structure destroyed by fire.

"The words 'sales tax' are still taboo in legislators' vocabularies, but it is predicted that by earmarking some of the revenue for old-age pensions, support could be won easily for the tax.

As one shrewd man behind the political scene put it, "Who could afford to oppose a sales tax with an old-age pension tie-up if he wanted to keep his seat in the legislature?"

Governor Martin's outspoken opposition to any new taxation kept the recent legislature in check and killed the perennial oleomargarine tax and a proposal to assess all amusements tickets 10 per cent.

But property taxpayers are clamoring for relief, and a sales tax to offset real property levies could be expected to find many friends, it is argued.

The governor has made no recent statement on taxation, but sources close to him say he would not oppose a sales tax but would not initiate the idea himself.

Half of the 48 states have sales taxes in various forms, some on occupations, some on gross incomes and others on gross sales. The states are: Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Maryland, Michigan, Mississippi, Missouri, New Mexico, North Carolina, North Dakota, South Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Utah, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia and Wyoming.

HOUSING DAY SET JUNE 15

Farm representatives of the federal housing administration are attempting to make Better Housing day, June 15, one of importance in rural communities. Although the farmers are busy in the fields at this season of the year, the women's division of many localities are sponsoring programs for this occasion.

National Better Housing day is being recognized throughout the country. Well over 1,000 model homes will be constructed following groundbreaking exercises to be held on that day.

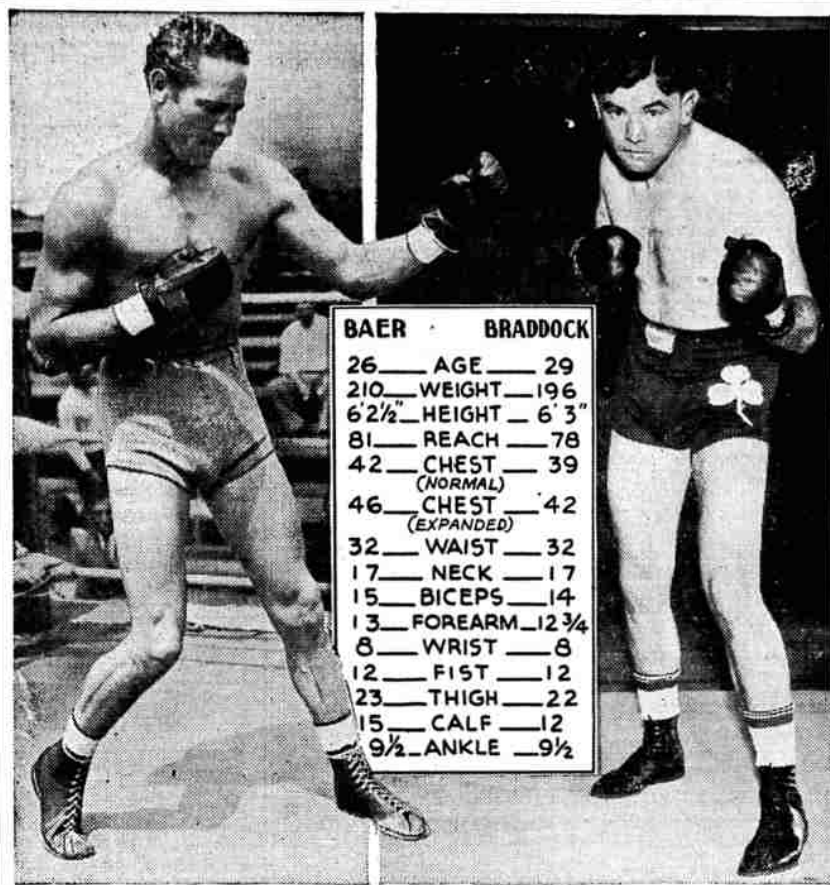
In rural communities where model homes are not to be erected, other celebrations will be held in recognition of the better housing program. Some towns will be visited by demonstration trucks and exhibits held.

Demonstration trucks are touring the states of Oregon, Idaho and Washington to assist in creating interest in farm programs of the federal housing administration. The trucks are sponsored by power companies and building and plumbing supply concerns, and the equipment carried in the cars is demonstrated at each place. One or more types of water systems are exhibited. Home lighting plants, plumbing fixtures and a model of a septic tank are generally carried.

Similar tours are being organized in other sections of the country to enable the residents of rural districts to see the sort of improvements which may be made to their property.

County Indigent Fund Nearing Exhaustion In Middle of Year

The \$60,000 fund budgeted by the county court for care of Marion county indigent will be exhausted before the end of July from present indications and it is indicated the burden of caring for the indigent will be thrown over at that time onto the state relief committee from state relief funds.

A letter received by the county court from Eimer R. Goudy, administrator for the state relief committee, conveyed the idea that the state committee will be ready to undertake the job when county funds are exhausted. The findings are the outgrowth of work done by a special committee appointed some time ago on how best to allocate the state funds among the counties.

In the letter of notification to the county court, the state relief committee says: "That it shall be the policy of the state relief committee to allocate funds under the terms of Chapter 303, Oregon Laws 1935, to the respective county relief committees only after the several counties have exhausted all funds available for relief of the indigent and unemployable persons and the members of their families, and proof of need made by the county relief committees."

The committee further advises in its letter that "the administrator is instructed to notify the several counties and give assurance that at such time as the indigent funds of any county shall be exhausted the state relief committee will take over its indigent load in accordance with the terms and conditions of the statute, suggesting to the several counties that in the meantime they continue to administer their indigent funds in the ordinary course."

As of May 1 there was but \$18,434.78 left in the Marion county indigent fund, the May bills not yet being fully audited and check-

ly growing instead of dwindling and for the first time in history a county relief fund has been depleted with the year only a little past the half way mark—and that the largest indigent fund ever allocated.

California People Touring Northwest
Only a few weeks behind the meandering Va of geese that fly northward in summer, the annual hordes of California vacationists have started their trek up into Oregon.

Non-resident motor vehicle registration compiled by the office of the Secretary of State Snell showed a total of 6850 cars in May. Of this number, Ashland, Grants Pass, Medford and Klamath Falls signed up 954, 1846, 435 and 417 respectively, the bulk of the California immigrants, who came into the state in 2864 automobiles. Washington contributed the second largest number of cars with 1340.
