

WATER BRINGS GOOD RESULTS POLK FARMERS

Dallas—Interest in irrigation continues to spread as was evidenced by the attendance of nearly 20 people at the demonstration meeting held on the Ira Ray farm at Elkins. Despite the fact that most farmers were engaged in harvesting their grain crops there were people in attendance from various parts of the Luckiamute valley.

Ira Ray is irrigating garden, blackberry, clover and evergreen. Lacking in water both the flooding and sprinkler type of systems. These were on display and demonstrated for the benefit of those in attendance at the meeting Monday morning.

Arthur King of the extension service was present to discuss various types of installations and offer the services of his office to aid in laying out plans for any farmer in the county.

Ray uses two pumps and each of them is driven by a Dodge automobile engine. The sprinkler system receives its water from a 2½-inch pump which delivers about 60 or 70 gallons per minute. The flooding system is operated with a four-inch centrifugal pump that runs from 300 to 400 gallons per minute with about the same power.

About an acre of Ladino clover was sown on which the two family cows had been pastured almost continuously since last spring. It showed the effects of feeding but the clover was growing vigorously and in spots was quite luxuriant. Ray has decided to level off any ground he irrigates in the future and was working on a piece at the time the group met.

Harvesting of wheat has not yet begun, but according to reports of seed dealers yields of oats, hairy vetch, and rye grass are exceptionally good. The grain is expected to run 500 or 550 pounds to the acre, with the Italian variety averaging about 500 pounds and occasionally reaching 800.
