

FAST DRIVING PROVES COSTLY TO MOTORISTS

Woodburn—Joseph M. McMenamin, of Portland, who was arrested July 15 for reckless driving, appeared in the local court Monday for trial before Judge Overton. Josephine Serely appeared as a witness for the defense. Witnesses for the state were H. C. McCallum, I. N. Shultz, A. L. Keele and State Officer Mogan who made the arrest.

After considering the testimony offered the judge found McMenamin guilty and imposed a fine and costs amounting to \$72.75 and a sentence of 60 days in the county jail. The execution of the jail sentence was suspended on condition that the defendant pay the fine and costs in full. He was allowed ten days in which to decide upon appeal. The case grew out of an accident near Brooks in which four cars were involved.

Howard R. Coffey of Salem was arrested for driving without an operator's license. After pleading guilty he was fined \$5 and costs of \$2.25.

George E. Towle entered a plea of guilty after being arrested for driving with a muffler cut out in operation and paid a \$5 fine and costs.

Frank Reeve of Eugene, arrested for driving a truck upon the highway at a speed of 45 miles per hour, entered a plea of guilty and was fined \$10 and costs.

O. H. Little, for driving at night with no headlights burning, paid a fine of \$5 and costs of \$2.25.

Silverton—Howard Madsen pled guilty to a speed charge in police Judge George Custer's court Monday evening and paid \$10 in fines and costs.

Silverton—John K. Paulson pled guilty to driving faster than the minimum speed law of the town and was fined \$15 including costs in Judge Custer's police court Saturday.

SUPERVISOR RETAINED

Albany—Decision to retain R. R. Robnett, Crawfordville, as road supervisor for the area composed of districts No. 21 and 22 in Linn county was announced Tuesday by the county court, after consideration of two opposing petitions, one asking Robnett's removal and the other asking that he be retained. The court issued a formal newspaper statement declaring that although the charge had been made that he was not fair to all parts of the district in hiring his help, it believed that his retention was desired by far the large majority of the taxpayers of the district and would be to the best interests of the whole area.
