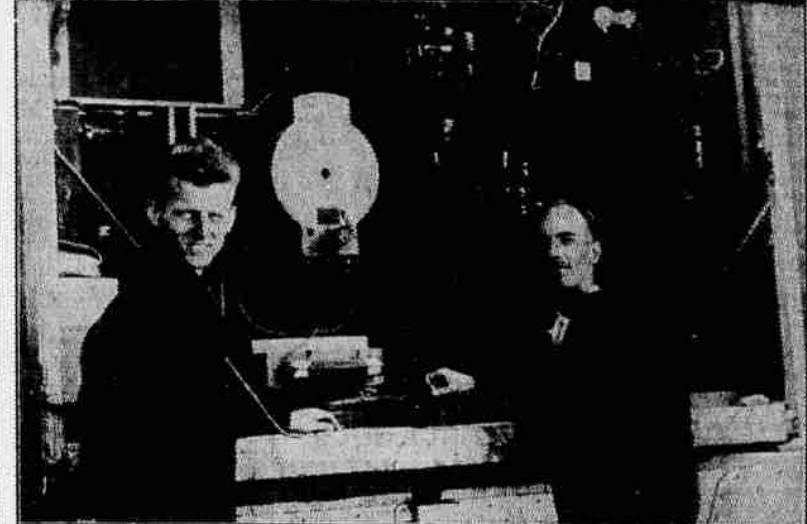
QUEEN CONTEST EXCITING AFFAIR

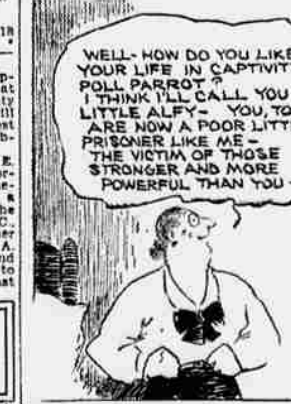

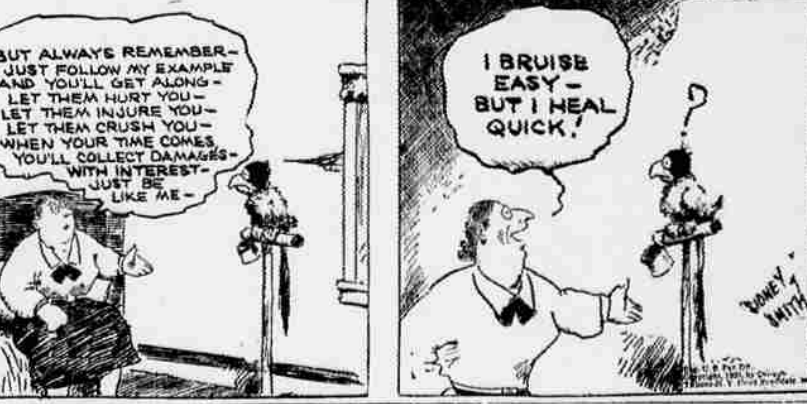
