FORECLOSURE OF DELINQUENT TAXES STARTS

Sheriff Sells 14 Parcels of Land Out of More Than 800 in List

Sale to be Continued Next Two Saturdays—Only One Bid on Each

With the beginning today of the largest tax foreclosure sale ever undertaken in Marion county, 14 parcels of property, out of the more than 800 on which the county is foreclosing, changed hands. The sale will be continued on the next two Saturdays, and all of the foreclosed property remaining after that will pass into the ownership of the county. Buyers pay delinquent taxes, penalty, interest and costs.


