hat and said: "Gentlemen, goodbye."

Looking neither to the left nor to the right, Townsend walked to the door of the committee room accompanied by Sheridan Downey, his counsel.

Chairman C. Jasper Bell, D. Mo., cried to captain policemen to bring the physician but he continued his progress through the door unreluctant amid the wild cheers of Townsendites who crammed the committee room.

Before taking his walk, Townsend had read extracts from a brief statement in which he charged the committee with a deliberately "unfriendly attitude" toward himself and the Townsend organization.

"I deem it my duty," he said, "to refuse to make any further appearance before your committee unless under arrest."

The committee recessed after the physician left the room and went into executive session to decide what to do.

In a surprise move, investigators presented testimony portraying Edward J. Margret, California state manager and national publicity director of the Townsend pension organization, as a one-time night club owner and whiskey hijacker.

The testimony was presented by Clarence A. Linn, San Francisco attorney, who was called as a witness when Dr. Francis E. Townsend, pension plan founder, was delayed in re-appearing for the house committee's afternoon session.

Linn's story dealt with the purported activities of Margret on the Pacific coast some 15 or 16 years ago. Linn identified Margret as a one-time owner of the Shamrock cafe, San Francisco night spot in which four persons were burned to death several days ago in a fire started accidentally by a "torch dancer."

Washington, May 21 (AP)—An assertion, immediately denied, that the Townsend old age pension organization used the mails to defraud was made today before a house investigating committee.

James R. Sullivan, committee counsel, declared that \$11,490 was raised for a "congressional fund" by an appeal to Townsend clubs sent through the mails in the form of "Townsendgrams."

"Did you make any effort to stop these contributions," Sullivan asked Dr. F. E. Townsend after reading a "Townsendgram" appeal for funds.

"No," Dr. Townsend replied. "We were after contributions."

Irish Culture Dates To 2000 Years B. C.
Belfast, Ireland (UP)—Excavation of a prehistoric tomb near Dunloy in County Antrim has revealed the burial customs of people who inhabited Ireland 2,000 years before Christ.

Archaeologists of Queen's university here said the discoveries showed "an astonishing variety of structural talent and culture among the people who evidently brought to Ireland their first knowledge of civilized life."

In the ancient tomb or burial chamber the excavators found traces of the cremation of human bodies as well as gifts to the dead, including two arrow heads, several knives and beads. The most important find was two finely polished stone axes, keen enough to cut paper sharply, which lay at the foot of the tomb.

San Francisco, Cal. (UP)—A record of murders in California during the past year disclosed that the most dangerous period is the three hours between 6 and 9 p. m. and the next most dangerous the three hours just past midnight.

The first seven hours of the accepted working day are comparatively safe, and not one murder occurred during the noon hour.

Most robberies occur between 6 p. m. and midnight.
