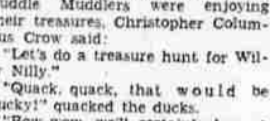

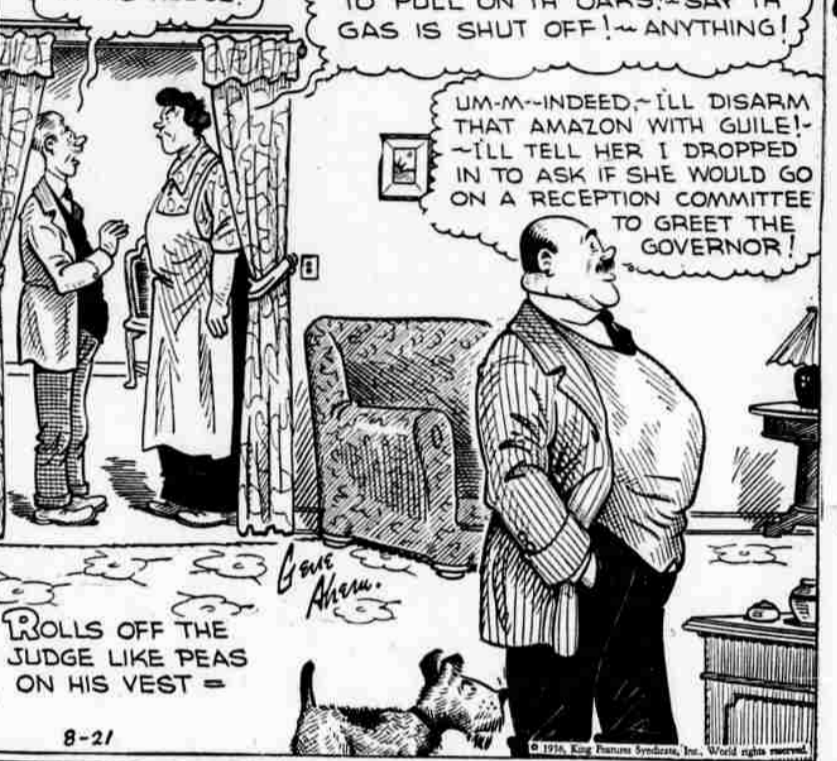

William Bowers Bourn was born in San Francisco and educated in Cambridge, England. He inherited the famous Empire Mine at Grass Valley from his father and accumulated a fortune from California mines and public utilities. In 1903 he purchased Lake Killarney and 10,000 acres surrounding it and in 1932 presented the property to the Irish Free State in memory of his daughter, Mrs. Maude Vincent, wife of a Free State senator. Mr. Bourn died on July 5, 1936, at the age of 78.
