

# HOOVER WILL BE ACTIVE IN FALL BATTLE

Marshallfield, Ore., Aug. 21 (AP)—Mr. J. Edgar Hoover, accompanied by Mr. and Mrs. W. C. Van Antwerp, Palo Alto friends, left Marshallfield today for a short vacation jaunt through Oregon, an itinerary which Mr. Hoover said was being set "by the women."

The Hoover party arrived here last night after a day's trip up the Redwood highway. They probably will continue to Eugene today, then over the Cascades to Bend and south to California, perhaps fishing along the way.

Over his coffee this morning the former president said he anticipated he would take an "active part" in the campaign this fall. "Active" was interpreted to mean a speaking role although the engagements for Mr. Hoover remain to be announced.

"August is a quiet month for politics," he said. "An organization is being prepared for the campaign in September and October. The republican party must and will make a fight in this campaign."

Mr. Hoover indicated he intended to do his part.

Mr. Hoover laughed at reports that he was re-entering mining, saying he had recently visited some properties of friends and advised them on their problems but had no present intention of entering his former vocation of mining engineer and operator.

# THOUSANDS NETTED BY LIQUOR STORES

The Oregon liquor control commission today reported a net profit of \$111,177.26 in its stores last month on gross sales of \$589,437.63. In the past seven months, the net profit has been \$770,914.99 on sales which ran to \$3,857,947.25.

The license division made \$4,070.69 last month and \$220,537.82 since the first of the year. The privilege tax division reported a profit of \$66,860.41 last month and \$347,397.91 since January 1.

Since the state went into the liquor business two and one-half years ago, \$2,962,428.82 has been turned over to unemployment relief.

# 10-TON STONE USED FOR ISLAND COIN

Honolulu, Aug. 21—Two "coins" weighing several hundred pounds each have become the property of the Bishop museum.

About two feet high, with a hole through the middle, the coins came from the island of Yap, where they were obtained by Yoshio Kondo, young collector of the museum.

Kondo found one circular "coin," hewn from stone and commonly used by natives of the island, about 9 feet high and weighing almost 10 tons.

This coin could purchase almost a complete village, he said. The smaller coins were said to be worth about one Japanese yen each, and
