The first period was scoreless but in the second quarter Harold Vogel, speedy quarter for Hubbard, broke away for several long runs and rolled up two touchdowns. He went over from the 12 yard line for the first and dashed 32 yards for the second. He also went around left end for the extra point on one occasion. In the third quarter Vogel again ran 15 yards for a touchdown and passed to Agee, right end, for the extra point. He threw a pass to Agee for another touchdown in the third period. In the fourth quarter Vogel was taken out and the Hubbard attack bogged down and only a safety was scored in the fourth period.

(Continued from page 1) King's household and their friends. King Edward was back at Sandringham today with his all-male shooting party after a mysterious absence of many hours.

He returned last night to the atmosphere of restrained jollity at Sandringham where his guests include Sir Samuel Hoare, 56, the ice skating first lord of the admiralty, and the dignified Earl of Harewood, 54, the king's brother-in-law.

There was no word as to the king's itinerary on his visit. The first direct reference in the British press to the Simpson divorce appears in the weekly news magazine, News Review, to be published tomorrow. It consists of a brief paragraph saying:

"Reporters were laying their lines last week when at Ipswich in readiness for a divorce suit between Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Aldrich Simpson. It is expected to come up for hearing next week before Mr. Justice Hawke."

London, Oct. 21 (AP)—Declaring it was "crown property" police today shooed loiterers away from Cumberland Terrace, site of the new home of Mrs. Wallis Simpson, King Edward's American friend.

A sergeant and two constables patrolled the district. Every time anyone tarried outside No. 16, Mrs. Simpson's home, they were told: "You won't see the person you want to see."

Pointing to lamp posts on which was embossed "C.R." (George Rex), one constable announced: "Ordinary garden people don't live here, y'know. This is crown property."

Someone asked him what would happen to persons who insisted on standing in Cumberland Terrace. "They'll likely get in serious trouble," the constable rejoined.

The "C.R." on the lamp posts means they were erected during the reign of the late King George, Edward's father, on ground which belongs to the crown and was leased to building landlords for 100 years or more.

Mrs. Simpson, herself, holds only a seven months' lease from Mrs. Cuthbert Stewart, who is the second leaseholder removed from the crown authorities.
