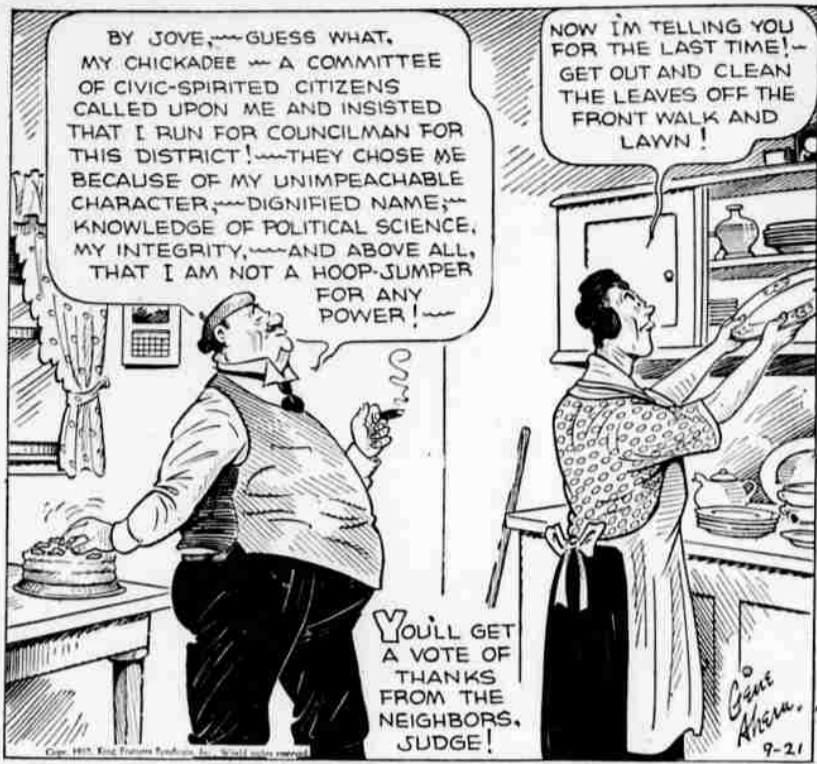

Mrs. Tumbleton Seeking Divorce

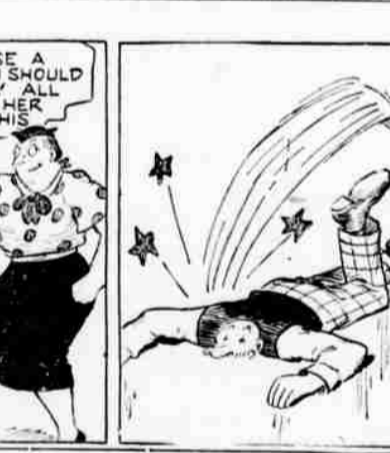
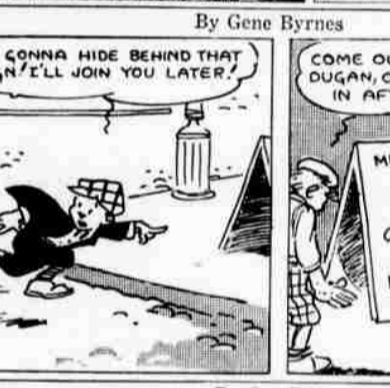
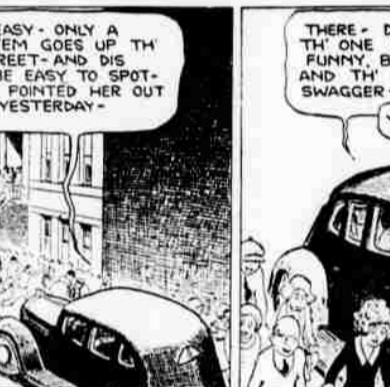
