Labor Peace Conference Collapses

timber industry dispute which the National Labor Relations board failed to mediate and which the governor of Oregon now is trying to settle.

The peace conferences between the two groups were scheduled to reconvene at 2:30 p. m. They adjourned 18 days after CIO chairman John L. Lewis and A. F. L. president William Green apparently failed to agree upon a truce. The results of those meetings will be reported officially to the committees today.

Much importance was attached to the reported timber industry memorandum, however, because labor department officials believe that the battle for dominance in the lumber industry crystallized the issues separating the Federation and the CIO.

Informed quarters believed Mr. Roosevelt may be considering some definite action to mediate the dispute or, at least, to signify his displeasure at its continuance.

The Oregon dispute involves the powerful carpenters' brotherhood of the Federation and the CIO's new timber workers' union, a faction which seceded from the Federation.

Senator Steiwer recently conferred with Mr. Roosevelt in an effort to obtain some action toward settlement of the dispute at Portland, where seven sawmills have been crippled or shut down by refusal of the AFL group to accept a decision by the national labor relations board making the CIO employ representative.

Steiwer said later the president had "been much interested" in the situation and had promised to "find out all the facts."

Senators Steiwer and McNary have sought a solution of the Portland tie-up through negotiation with the labor board. Steiwer said, however, he finally had "washed" his hands of the matter as far as the board was concerned because it apparently was "without power" to enforce its rulings.

McNary asserted it looked to him as though the labor board were "resting on its oars" until it determined whether the CIO and AFL would patch up differences at conferences here.
