

Old People's Home in Need Of More Space

Necessity for additional space to care for the growing needs of the institution was one of the problems confronting the board of directors of the Methodist Old People's home when the group met recently for a discussion of annual reports and the election of officers. Despite the fact that all available space on the two main floors of the home, located at Center and Statesman streets, is being utilized, the board is faced with a waiting list of elderly folk who are anxious to enter the institution. Space on the third floor cannot be utilized until partitions have been constructed and plumbing equipment installed. Lack of funds prevents this much needed improvement.

Reports indicated considerable progress had been made toward eliminating the building debt. This has been reduced to around \$6500. With this debt wiped out, it was said, the saving in interest could be applied to the needed improvements. Another improvement which the board hopes to make is the addition of several rooms which can be used for hospital cases. Present facilities make it necessary to send guests of the home to the city hospitals when they become too ill to be cared for in their rooms.

Operating expenses of the home average around \$1200 a month. This includes salaries of the employees, food for the 42 guests, expenses of doctors and nurses and general maintenance of the building and grounds.

Due to increased operating costs, it was found necessary to increase the entrance fees. Persons between the ages of 70 and 75 years are charged \$1500, while those 75 and older are permitted to enter for \$1000.

The home was established in 1909 at Perry and 12th streets. At that time the entrance fee was based on what the guest could afford. Some of them were admitted for \$500 or even less. However, it was learned that the institution could not be operated on this basis and the entrance regulations changed. James Webber, 88 years of age, is the oldest guest from the standpoint of continuous residence at the home.

Members of the board expressed their appreciation for the variety of entertainment given the guests of the home by various groups of the city. They extend an invitation to residents of Salem and the valley to visit the home and become acquainted with its operation and the purposes for which it was founded.

Wiping out of the debt and adding to the \$25,000 endowment are two of the objectives adopted by the board for the year.

Officers elected were Mrs. A. B. Evans, president; Mrs. E. E. Gilbert, recording secretary; Mrs. Oren Stratton, corresponding secretary; and Mrs. John Bertelson, treasurer.

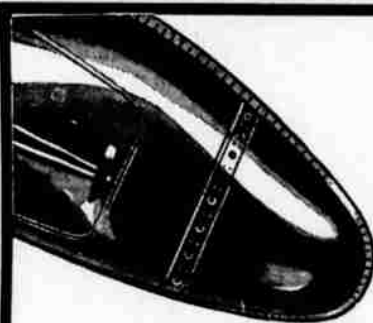
