

Posthumous Reward Goes To E. J. Neil

Atlantic City, N. J., July 13 (AP)—A posthumous award went today to the late Edward J. Neil, noted Associated Press sports-writer and foreign correspondent, for his work in covering the Spanish civil war.

The National Headliners' club honored Neil in its annual awards announced yesterday, with a gold medal which will be presented to his widow, Neil died January 2 of wounds suffered while at work in Spain.

Other awards, made by a committee of 15 newspaper, newsreel and radio men headed by Jack Price of Editor and Publisher and to be presented at the frolic Saturday night, follow:

Best and most colorful story—W. B. Ragdale of the Washington Bureau of the Associated Press, for a story on Al Capone and the Detroit purple gang.

Best foreign newsreel—Norman Alley's shots of the Panay bombing for Universal Newsreel.

Best foreign news reporting—The story of the bombing of Shanghai

by John R. Morris of the United Press.

Best news photo—Picture of a wailing Chinese baby in the middle of a bombed railroad station. The picture was part of a newsreel shot by H. G. Wong of Hearst's News of the Day.

Best domestic news reporting—James and John Metcalfe and William Mueller, Chicago Times reporters, for a series on the German-American bund.

Best domestic newsreel scene—Albert Mingalone, Paramount newsreel photographer, who was carried 13 miles by a cluster of balloons in Maine.

The Kansas City Journal-Post won the award for "outstanding service to the public" with a campaign to rid that city of vandalism and racketeering.

The best column award went to Raymond Clapper, Washington columnist, for the United Feature Service, while Joseph Aloop and Turner Cattedge won the plaque for the best non-fiction magazine article for their description in the Saturday Evening Post of the fight for enlargement of the supreme court.

Cascade Locks May Operate Utility

Portland, July 13 (AP)—Cascade Locks, first city to purchase electrical energy from Bonneville dam, asked J. D. Ross, project administrator, today to determine a "fair price" for acquiring the facilities of the West Coast Power company.

The city council said its application to the company for a selling price had been "fruitless." It resolved to follow Ross' advice before engaging in an "uneconomic competitive situation."

Cascade Locks voters approved a municipal district last week to distribute Bonneville power and authorized a \$12,000 bond issue for construction or acquisition of necessary lines.

Al Smith Grins At Name Senator

Albany, N. Y., July 13 (AP)—Former Governor Alfred E. Smith was referred to on the floor of the constitutional convention yesterday as "senator."

United States Senator Robert F. Wagner, democrat, in the course of debate on grade crossing elimination costs, asked:

"Will the senator yield?"

Smith's face broke into a big grin. "I'm not a senator yet," he said. "I didn't intend it to be a prophetic remark," responded Wagner.

Smith has been suggested by republican Representative Hamilton Fish as an anti-new deal candidate for the senate seat recently made vacant by the death of Royal S. Copeland.

FDR Rapped By Al Smith

Albany, N. Y., July 13 (AP)—Former Governor Alfred E. Smith criticized President Roosevelt and Congress yesterday for failure to help the railroads "get out of the red." He made the criticism at New

York's constitutional convention in a speech opposing an amendment to a proposal which would require the state to pay the cost of grade crossing eliminations.

Deploping what he termed the federal government's refusal to act on the railroad's "cry for relief," Smith said:

"I can't understand how congressmen seeking re-election, after throwing around billions of dollars like sawdust on an old time bar

room floor, can talk against a bond issue which would aid the railroads."

"Congress and the president of the United States," he said, not mentioning the name Roosevelt, "have not acted and here we are talking about railroads paying some part of eliminating grade crossings."
