

Free Course In Swimming Comes to End

Lebanon—The free course of swimming lessons, sponsored by the Lebanon Red Cross and with the cooperation of the city-WPA recreational program, closed Monday morning when the last of three tests was completed.

The program was considered an outstanding success in every way. Registration added up to 114, materially greater than last year, and the number who passed their tests successfully compares more than favorably with the number of last year. This year's registration was so heavy and the courses so popular that the courses were held over a period of three weeks rather than two as it was last year.

Miss Lenore Soule was chief instructor. She was assisted by Jack Dillard, Bob Simpson and Bob Thorne, who are regular lifeguards at the city pool.

In the beginners' class, 78 registered and 10 passed beginners' skills. They were: Marie Beale, Kyle Calahan, Rodney Cox, Nancy Gleason, Norma Goldhammer, Ruth Johnson, Lorene Larson, Paul McCracken, Dorothy Myers and Betty Strunk. Sixty others learned to swim but could not qualify for tests.
