Legislators Work on 12 Point Program

The legislature, with two weeks of its 40th session behind, was well on its way today toward action on its 12-point program. The recommendations of Gov. Charles A. Sprague also are well on their way to legislative action, the legislature having showed signs it would cooperate with him.

When the lawmakers meet Monday, they are expected to begin debate on the more important bills. Here's how the legislative program stacks up today:

- 1. The ways and means committee is at work on the governor's \$106,000,000 budget, which calls for \$13,000,000 appropriations. The governor recommended \$22,000,000 for relief, to be shared by the federal government, state and counties. Because their share is increased by \$2,000,000, the counties are expected to ask more state assistance.
2. The governor's proposed amendment to the unemployment compensation law, which the executive hopes will overcome federal social security board objections, will be debated in the senate Monday. Labor abandoned hopes of repealing the anti-picketing law, but argues that repeal is necessary before the government will certify the unemployment law.
3. An amendment permitting people's utility districts to issue revenue bonds will be introduced in the senate the first of next week.
4. The battle over diversion of highway revenues is on. The joint highway committee is considering a proposed constitutional amendment forbidding diversion, while the League of Oregon Cities said it would introduce a bill to divert \$880,000 a year for maintenance of city streets.
5. The proposed 44 hour week, 28 cents per hour law, which the federal government asked the legislature to pass, apparently will not be introduced.
6. The senate will begin arguments soon on the proposal to repeal the milk control law.
7. The perpetual battle between sports and commercial fishermen will come to a head in a few days.
