

### Legion Will Underwrite Cost Of Convention

Merchants of Salem will not be called upon to underwrite the cost of the state convention of the American Legion to be held here August 19 to 22 and any financing will be accomplished by the united efforts of the six posts of the county, it was decided at a short business meeting of Capital Post No. 9 which was held last night at the regular meeting of the Marion county council.

Financing of the convention will be accomplished by a mass Fourth of July celebration at the state fairgrounds, under wording of a resolution submitted by O. E. (Moose) Palmater, past state commander. C. J. Towe, of Delbert Reeves post No. 7, Silverton, urged all posts in the county to request fullest cooperation in their cities. Colors of Capital Post were draped with crepe by Art Johnson and Post Commander Brazier C. Small ordered this in effect for 30 days in memory of the late Frederick Steiner, former United States senator who died February 3. The council took similar action and all posts of the county will so display their colors.

Presiding at the council meeting were Fred Prosser of Mt. Angel, council president, and Irl McSherry, secretary, with Jerry Gower, of Newberg, district commander, a special guest.

Sentiment was expressed at the meeting as against S. B. 36, brought to the attention of the gathering by E. H. Bassett, Salem. The bill, now pending, provides for an appropriation of \$8,000 per biennium for the expenses of a state service officer. At previous state conventions the American Legion has gone on record as ready to "stand on its own feet" and not to ask the taxpayers to provide any such funds. It was brought out that at no meeting of the state department heads or state conventions had such a proposal been authorized.

Reports on the various posts in the county were given by Post Commander Small, Salem; Acting Commander Sam Yoder, Woodburn; Post Commander George Manolis, Silverton; Post Commander George Clinton, Aurora; Dr. James E. ### Pilot Bill Vetoed By Governor

Gov. Charles A. Sprague Monday used his veto power for the first time when he killed the controversial pilot bill because "it would tighten the monopolistic hold of the Columbia river pilots' association and the bar pilots' association." The bill would provide for state-

wide representation on the board, and limit the number of bar pilots to eight.

"It is not sound public policy for the state to foster closed monopolies. The state should license all pilot applicants who meet the necessary qualifications," he wrote in his veto message.

### Higher Salary Bill Defeated Again

The senate refused for the second time Monday to pass a bill increasing the state labor commissioner's salary from \$2,600 to \$4,200.

The bill, which previously passed the house, was voted down Saturday in the senate. It again failed to receive a majority Monday, final vote showing 14 ayes, 14 noes, with

two absent. Sen. Rex Mills (R., Pendleton), who moved to reconsider the vote, pleaded with the senate to be "fair," pointing out the labor commissioner is the lowest paid man who has to run for office.

Objections were immediately raised by Sen. Lew Wallace (D., Portland), and Howard Beiton (R., Canby), each asking: "When has the state paid men to run for public office?"

A bill which would take the milk board out of the smaller cities was

voted off the table and placed on Tuesday's calendar. It was introduced by Rep. Giles French (R., Moro), and has already passed the house.
