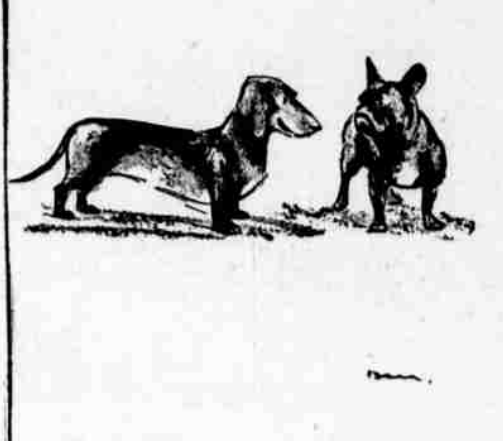

EXPLORES CLAIMS Region for America Los Angeles, March 21 (AP)—Lincoln Ellsworth, explorer and aviator, arrived here Monday on his return from his fourth aerial expedition over the South Pole wastes with the announcement that he had laid claim to 81,000 square miles of territory in the name of the United States.

The same area already has been claimed by the Australian and British governments, he said, declaring he would suggest early formation of a commission to determine the rightful claims to the disputed areas of the Antarctic.

Ellsworth, who came here directly from Australia, was met by Mrs. Ellsworth. He will remain here three weeks before going to New York to report to the National and American Geographic societies, sponsors of his expedition.
