And so they came "early on the first day of the week, at sunrise" to anoint the body for burial. As they approached the tomb, the question presented itself, "How shall we move the stone?" But when they got there, they looked, and behold, the stone was rolled away!

Stranger still, there was a young man sitting in the sepulchre, wearing a white robe; and he said to them, "Do not be amazed; you are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He is not here—he is risen; see, here is the place where he lay hid."

Celebration of the event as told in the above sketch from the Gospel as it varies to the Resurrection, will take various forms. Easter Sunday, clad in new raiment, symbolical of the season, capital city residents will visit the churches of their faith where they will listen to appropriate messages and give ear to serious discussions of the meaning of Easter and the risen Christ.
