

Assassination Only Beginning Of Nazi Revolt

Budapest, Sept. 21 (AP)—Rumanian diplomats in Hungary said today they interpreted the assassination of their premier as "highly significant just at the moment when German and Russian troops are approaching Rumania's northern frontier."

"Maybe the murder of Calinescu is only the beginning of something much bigger," one Rumanian official said.

These Rumanians disclosed the Bucharest government had suppressed rigidly news of iron guard agitation throughout Rumania which, they said, began as soon as German forces began their eastward march through Poland near the Rumanian border.

(Rumania's assassinated premier, Armand Calinescu, had been the foe of the pro-Nazi iron guard which Rumania outlawed some years ago.)

Calinescu's assassination today in Bucharest was followed by action to seal Rumania from the rest of the world.

Soon after the Bucharest radio had announced "a successful attempt has been made on the life of Calinescu," it was reported Rumanian frontiers were closed tightly by orders from Bucharest.

All telephone communication with Rumania ceased a few minutes later. The government radio station in Bucharest went off the air.

The Rumanian legation here said that before the station stopped broadcasting there were "some minutes of wild and confused shouting."

In reports of pro-Nazi agitation in Rumania it was recalled that just yesterday a Rumanian official at Cernauti disclosed police arrested a group of German residents of Bukovina province on charges they plotted a revolt to join Germany if Nazi troops in Poland arrived at the Rumanian frontier.

Calinescu frequently had charged the iron guard was financed and given orders by Berlin.

Legion to Adopt Neutrality Policy

Chicago, Sept. 21 (AP)—The present neutrality law, says National Commander Stephen P. Chadwick of the American Legion, "should be left alone as long as it keeps us neutral."

Chadwick said yesterday he was speaking for himself rather than for the Legion in voicing opposition to revision of the neutrality act.

"I cannot speak the Legion's mind," he said, "but I think I am with the Legion in saying that we believe that a true neutrality policy is more important than any particular law."

The American Legion's official stand on the question of revising the neutrality law is expected to be determined at its national convention here next week.

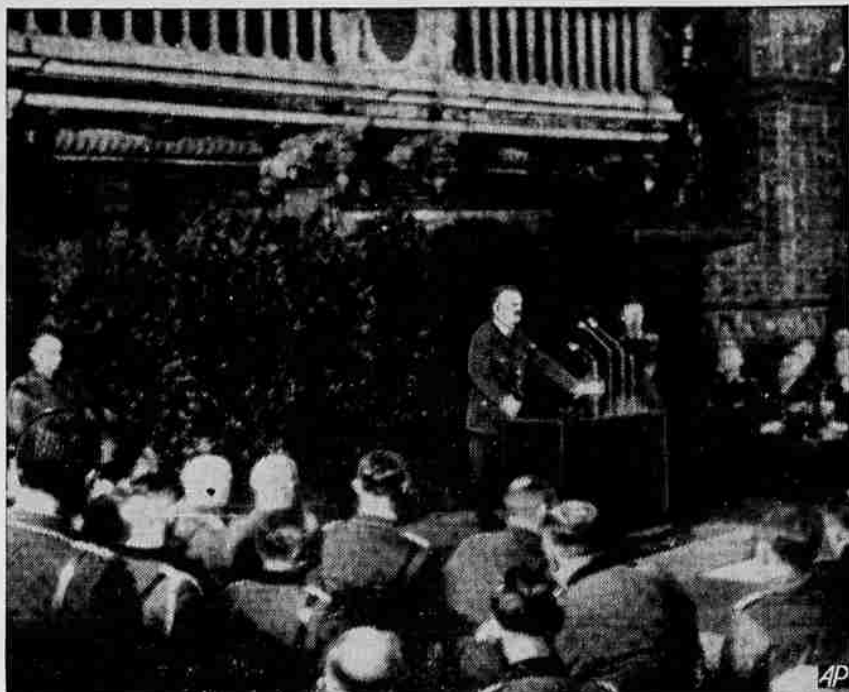

Something Phoney Suspected in War

Detroit, Sept. 21 (AP)—Henry Ford emphasized today the events of the last 25 years have not changed his "unalterable opposition" to war in any form or place nor his determination to do his utmost to prevent the coming of another world conflict.

A quarter-century ago Ford sent a "peace-ship" to Europe in the hope he might "get the boys out of the trenches before Christmas." He has no plans for another such expedition, he said, but he made it clear he intended to make himself heard against any movement which he believes might threaten a spread of the present war in Europe.

Specifically, Ford expressed his opposition to any amendment of the present neutrality law.

"That law," he said, "was written to keep us out of war. Any tampering with it, any change in it whatever, will be a step toward getting us into a war that will bring untold misery to millions of persons, and set us back thousands of years."

Ford said he wasn't so sure there was "much of a war under way at present." "I am inclined to agree with Senator Borah's view," he added, "Borah (R-Idaho) was quoted in dispatches Monday as expressing the belief there was 'something phoney' about the war in Europe."

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Jewish Refugees Ordered to Leave Rumania

Bucharest, Rumania, Sept. 21 (AP)—Thousands of Jewish refugees from Poland were terrified today by a Rumanian government's order that "all undesirable aliens" must leave the country within 15 days.

Many of the tens of thousands of Polish refugees streaming southward from the border were Jews. Many of them had been on the move since Germany began expanding eastward and southward, through Austria and Czechoslovakia. They had been permitted to cross freely into Rumania the past few days during the great crush of refugee Polish soldiers, civilians and diplomats at the frontier. Now they were to be shunted off again and few had the means to proceed to a friendly country.

The Rumanian order did not specify Jews, and authorities said it included "undesirable" Christians as well, but there was no doubt that Jews would be most affected. A government spokesman said if the measure had specified Jews it would have invited protests from countries, including the United States, where the Jewish population is not restricted.

Rumania has attempted to restrict Jews to five per cent of its 19,000,000 population and has placed many economic restrictions on the five per cent. Poland's population of 32,000,000 was one-tenth Jewish. They were among the first to flee the German invaders.

Rumania also planned to get rid of almost 20,000 Polish soldiers who had crossed the border during the past week to be interned. The German announcement that the Polish campaign had been "closed" was believed to have opened the way for disposition of these troops soon.

Ralph Swarts, 56, Dies at Residence

He was born September 22, 1883. His parents were Richard and Carrie Swarts, pioneers who crossed the plains in 1849 and settled in Salem. Mr. Swarts was active in charity and social service work.

Survivors include the widow, Nellie; one foster son, Marc Renne; brother, Simon Swarts of Salem; sisters, Mrs. I. C. Goodrich of Portland, Mrs. Grace O'Neill of Salem, Mrs. John Payne of Fresno, Calif.

Funeral services will be held Saturday at 2 p. m. from the Walker and Howell funeral home. Interment will be in Cityview cemetery.

Contract Let for Six New Vessels

Washington, Sept. 21 (AP)—The maritime commission Wednesday awarded a contract to the Sun Shipbuilding and Drydock company, of Chester, Pa., for construction of six direct drive diesel cargo vessels of the C-2 design to cost \$2,277,000 each.

This brings awards under the commission's construction program to 114 ships.

The C-2 ships are 450 feet overall; 13,900 tons displacement and have a speed of 15½ knots.

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Patrol Boats Rescue Crew Of Blasted Ship

London, Sept. 21 (AP)—The British government announced today that two royal air force flying patrol boats had rescued the crew of 34 of the steamship Kensington Court, which sent out an SOS after having been attacked by a submarine.

A ministry of information announcement said that the rescue, somewhere in the Atlantic ocean, was the first case in which an entire ship's crew had been picked up at sea by flying boats.

The Kensington Court was a 4,803-ton vessel, owned by the Court Line, London was her port of registry. (The Kensington Court left Ro-

sario, Argentina, on August 15. Her destination then was Dakar, French West Africa, but apparently she had been diverted because of the outbreak of war.

(She was built in 1927 in Glasgow and was 396 feet long and had a 53 foot beam.)

The ministry's announcement said the flying boats, responding to an SOS, arrived alongside a lifeboat from the Kensington Court 10 minutes before the steamer sank.

The announcement said:

"The pilots saw a tiny boat crowded with men while others were in the sea clinging to the sides.

"While one flying boat kept watch from the air the other came down on the water alongside the overloaded lifeboat. Fourteen of the men, some in a desperate condition, were pulled into the aircraft. When it had taken off with the heavy load, the other aircraft

Douglas Names Snohomish Man

Washington, Sept. 21 (AP)—Supreme court justices are supposed to be impartial but Justice William O. Douglas is partial to the northwest United States, in at least one respect.

So long as he remains on the supreme court bench, Douglas intends to select his law clerks from law school graduates in Washington, Oregon and Idaho. He spent most of his youth in Washington, which descended and picked up 20 more men.
