Mine Company Suit Started
Yakima, Dec. 21 (AP)—To determine whether the Sunlight Mining company is engaged in commerce within the meaning of the United States constitution and the fair labor standards act was filed in the United States district court in Idaho yesterday by Elwood Hutcherson, representing J. C. Cheney, attorney for the plaintiff.
Naming 31 defendants in the suit to win exclusion from the jurisdiction of the wage and hour division of the department of labor, the complaint also asked that each of the defendants be restrained from instituting any action against the plaintiff company arising from claimed violation of the act.
In the event the court holds the plaintiff subject to operations of the act, the corporation demands that the court adjudge the lunch period of employees is not part of the maximum hours. John A. Carver, district attorney, heads the list of defendants which includes officers of Wallace and Kellogg mine unions.
The company, the complaint states, desired to return to the six day week. Reduction of hours to conform with the act makes it difficult for each of the 600 employees though the limited mine space makes it impossible to step up operations by increasing the crew. The net effect of the act is a loss of \$356 annually for each worker and also a hampering of the company operations.

King Indignant At Atrocities
London, Dec. 21 (AP)—King George VI, visiting the ministry of agriculture and fisheries today, expressed indignation over reported German machine-gunning of British fishermen. The King's comment was made to Sir John Marsden of the British Fishery Federation.
Admiral Jean Darlan, supreme commander of French naval forces, was received by the King at Buckingham palace.
Dan Hellman of the fishermen's union said, after the king's visit: "I told the king the fishermen are having a helluva time on account of the present tactics of the enemy. I described in detail how one Scottish trawler was attacked by German planes with bombs and machine guns.
"I said that in the fishing industry we had to deal with even greater problems than did His Majesty himself.
"The king said he quite understood the situation."
