RADIO Day by Day

New York, June 7 (AP)—A question much to the fore in the public mind, "Should the U. S. sell spare planes to the allies?" comes into broadcasting on Sunday evening.

It will be debated in the American Forum on the MRS. chain, with Senator Claude Pepper of Florida, who favors the proposal, and Senator Ernest Lundeen of Minnesota, who opposes, as the principal speakers. Four others are to participate in the usual panel discussion to follow the main talk.

Cancellation of the broadcast of President Roosevelt's address at the 15th anniversary celebration of Vauxcel's roller at the Waldorf-Astoria, N. Y., on Sunday afternoon was announced from Washington because of the President's attention to war problems. It had been listed for three chains.

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
