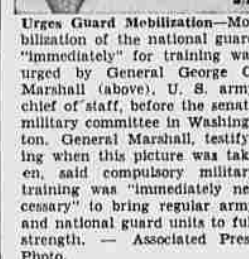
Bodies Found In Apartment

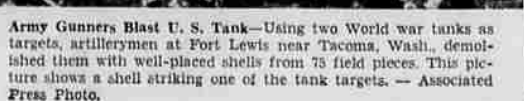

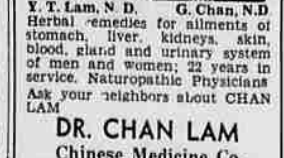
