

Guardsmen Getting Real Army Training

Yelm, Wash., Aug. 8 (AP)—The United States army, driving to strengthen its National Guard troops as rapidly as possible, is revising the old cliché to read: All work and no play makes soldiers smart boys.

More than 40,000 regular army and National Guard troops concentrated from eight far western states for the fourth army maneuvers are quickly learning that their three week encampment isn't, as Major General George A. White, commander of the guard's 41st division, puts it, "the usual summer picnic."

"We're concentrating on discipline and fighting fitness," General White declared. "We've got to scrape the tin off any tin soldiers."

There's a five star reason for the all work and no play theory: If President Roosevelt's proposed bill goes through congress, some National Guard divisions, including the 41st, will be called up.

If conscription follows, National Guard troops will join the regular army in training recruits, concentrating on improving the effectiveness of the guardsmen.

They're training nine instead of the usual seven hours a day. They are being rapidly schooled to proficiency in using the latest type weapons. They're studying the changes the European war has brought in military tactics. They're undergoing grueling marches to toughen them up for whatever lies ahead.

Leaves have been restricted on rounds that "a man can't train all day and be out all night." Coached by regular army troops, principally from the third division, the National Guardsmen concentrated in a 9,000 square mile prairie region here have been getting anti-tank training, chiefly in tank defense tactics. Many of the guardsmen, from Washington, Oregon, California, Nevada, Utah, Idaho, Montana and Wyoming, are working for the first time as parts of a full division.

Jacobs May Buy Brooklyn Club

New York, Aug. 8 (AP)—Mike Jacobs, boxing promoter, said today a meeting will be held Friday to consider the purchase of the Brooklyn Dodgers by a syndicate headed by himself.

Jacobs said the Brooklyn Trust company, which holds 50 percent of the stock in trust for heirs of the late Charles Ebbets, had offered him controlling interest in the baseball club but that his syndicate wants 100 percent or nothing.

If the bank persuades the Stephen McKeever heirs to dispose of their share, Jacobs said negotiations looking to the sale would be resumed.

In New York Mr. Price met a Viennese refugee, Josef Goldman, who was brought to the states through the interest of a Salem banker. Mr. Goldman was a banker in Vienna before Hitler took over Austria. His fortune was confiscated by the Nazis and in desperation he wrote to 100 bankers in the United States asking for aid in coming to America. Only one person bothered to answer his plea and that was the Salem banker.

After the Viennese banker arrived in the states the Salem man lent him money, which the refugee used to establish a cold cream and cosmetics company. He is using a famous old formula for his products and apparently doing well in his new venture.

With Mr. Goldman and his wife Mr. Price attended the New York World's fair and other points of interest in Manhattan.

Tropic Storm Blows Self Out

Port Arthur, Tex., Aug. 8 (AP)—A tropical hurricane blew itself out inland today after killing at least one person, injuring 10 and damaging property in the Sabine area of Texas and Louisiana.

Scores were marooned at 75-mile winds roared into Texas from the east and struck Port Arthur, Orange and Beaumont.

Houses were unroofed, trees uprooted and advertising signs sent whirling through the air. Six persons were injured at Port Arthur and three at Beaumont, where damage to windows and small buildings was widespread. None of the injured was reported hurt seriously.

Unofficially, damage was estimated at Port Arthur at \$100,000. Jefferson County Agent J. F. Combs said damage to the rice crop in that section may reach \$500,000.

The body of Chen Tung Sing, a Chinese, was found in Bayou Barataria at Crown Point, La.

R. E. Miller, 24, a lineman, was knocked unconscious at New Orleans by a 4000-volt wire while repairing a line atop a 40-foot pole. His safety belt kept him from falling.

Twenty-two persons on fishing parties out of Morgan City, La., were reported safe.
