Funeral services for Mrs. Anna Kurz Zosel will be held Tuesday afternoon at 3 o'clock, at the Clough-Barrick chapel. Rev. G. F. Lening and Rev. J. E. Campbell will officiate and interment will be in Belcrest Memorial park.

Mrs. Zosel, 76, who for 40 years had been active in community and church affairs in and about Salem, passed away at her home at Liberty Friday. She had been in failing

health for more than a year. Mrs. Zosel was born June 22, 1864, at Waterloo, Wis., a daughter of John and Sophia Herman Kurz. She was married at Wadena, Minn., November 29, 1889, to William Zosel. In 1899 they came to Oregon and settled at Liberty where they have lived continuously since.
