Chart Employed In Study of Geography

Mr. Stewart's ninth grade classes at Parrish are attacking their work in World Geography in a manner that is proving very interesting. A large chart is posted on the blackboard, which outlines the work to be covered and explains the way in which it is to be handled. This chart states "In school most of our knowledge comes through reading. We use our sight more than any other sense. Therefore, we must be skilled in the understanding and using of certain tools. We must develop our ability to read, interpret, and use these tools."

Tools are described as maps, graphs, books, magazines, pictures, etc. We as students use these tools to study the world in which we live. Our task this year is to learn the culture of other people and see how it affects our own way of life.

Each student selects one or more countries whose culture is studied in details.

The findings are presented to the class by means of maps, graphs, charts, essays and scrapbooks. This data will form the basis of the group work.

The projector has been in steady use to project the map of each country chosen, in order that a perfect map may be made.

Textbooks used in connection with this work are "Modern World Geography" by Case and Bermark, "Geography and Society," by Chamberlain, and "Nations as Neighbors," by Packard and Slinnot.
