We used to speculate about how America and Britain could maintain order in a naughty world if they only would combine their vast strengths to that end. Marching as One

The opportunity is about to be given us to do more than ever has been done before in implementing the teachings of the Sermon on the Mount, which marked another great epoch. We are reaching this opportunity through a valley of tears—but we are arriving.

Few developments could have given the allied peoples greater courage to carry out the immediate task before us—the wiping out of Hitler and Hitlerism. This momentous agreement comes as we finally have struggled to the crest of the hill and are at grips with Hitler in the decisive struggle.
