

Albany Starts Army Program; Welfare Costly

Albany—With the first of the men representing the armed forces at Camp Adair, and the leasing of the Sternberg building at First and Lyon streets for the USO center, the defense recreation committee of Albany has swung into play the plans which it had been making for the past several months, it was announced by V. A. Hurley, chairman of the committee.

The official questionnaire applications for girls for the junior hospitality league have just come from the printer's press and are at the Albany Chamber of Commerce office for girls of Albany and surrounding communities, Mr. Hurley said.

Girls 18 or over and out of high school and not married will be given permanent cards which will entitle them to visit the USO building for all social functions. Each questionnaire must have three recommendations it was stated.

Aid Being Withheld

Albany—Total expenditures under public assistance for June, according to John Beard, administrator of the Linn county public welfare commission were \$21,502.32, after the figures for the month had been tabulated.

Old age assistance, with six cases added and 10 discontinued received the largest amount of money with \$14,590 being spent in June.

Beard said that during the present time of defense and seasonal employment, the welfare commission was not assisting any persons in families where there are fully employable persons.
