## Primary Balloting In Five States Today

Primary balloting in five states today (Tuesday) produces a test of presidential influence and pre-war foreign policies in New York's selection of congressional nominees and convention delegates who will pick candidates for governor.

Voters determine congressional and gubernatorial candidates in Idaho, Ohio and Nebraska and decide a run-off between two senatorial aspirants in Arkansas. But chief political interest is centered on the contest in President Roosevelt's home state.

New York's selection of delegates to the democratic convention, Aug. 19, was expected to disclose the respective strength of the party's two gubernatorial candidates, Senator James M. Mead and State Attorney General John J. Bennett, Jr.

The president has asserted he would support Mead if he could vote in the convention. Mr. Roosevelt's former campaign manager, state democratic chairman James A. Farley, is backing Bennett.

Meanwhile, supporters of Thomas E. Dewey, 1938 republican nominee for governor, claimed pledges from enough delegates to win him the party's nomination.

The democratic contest, precipitated by refusal of Governor Herbert H. Lehman to seek a fifth term, shared the spotlight with Representative Hamilton Fish's race against three opponents for the republican renomination for congress in the president's home district.

Fish, one of 43 representatives to be nominated in the Empire state, was an outspoken critic of the administration's foreign policy before Pearl Harbor. His opponents, who based their campaign on what they termed his isolationist views, are Augustus W. Bennett, Newburgh attorney; State Assemblyman Emerson D. Fite, Vassar college professor, and Edward J. Bowen, a frequent candidate.

In Ohio, democratic nomination for the governorship was sought by Frank A. Dye, State Auditor Joseph T. Ferguson, Walter F. Heer, a county democratic committee chairman; former State Treasurer Clarence H. Knisley, and former Representative John McSweeney. Governor John H. Brieker had no republican opposition in his bid for a third term.

All Ohio's congressmen asked renomination but one, Representative Robert T. Secrest, who resigned to remain a lieutenant commander in the naval service.

Nebraska's republican governor, Dwight Griswold, competes with one opponent for renomination while three democrats are vying for the designation. While Senator George W. Norris has not said whether he would run again on the independent ticket, seven democrats and three republicans asked nomination to the office.

In Idaho, Governor Chase A. Clark looked for renomination on the democratic ticket. The

## Awoke to Find Sailor in Bed Fully Clothed

Seattle, Aug. 11 (AP)—Mrs. June Twitchell, 22, awoke at 4 a.m. this morning, stretched out her arms lazily and yawned. Across the apartment bedroom her 7-month-old daughter slept soundly and her other daughter, 4, breathed quietly in her little bed.

Then Mrs. Twitchell's hand touched something and she froze with fright. The "something" was a fully clothed—shoes and all—sailor in the other side of her bed.

"I was afraid to move," Mrs. Twitchell said later.

"He wasn't snoring and he was breathing so quietly I was afraid he wasn't asleep."

"I inched myself over toward the edge of the bed. It seemed an age before I got there—and I guess it was about half an hour. Then I slipped quietly to the floor and sneaked over and aroused Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Carlin, who live next door."

The sailor woke up a few minutes later to see two policemen standing near the bed and near the door two women clad in nightclothes and a man with tousled hair, holding a gun emerging from his bathrobe sleeve.

## 125,000 Dogs For War Work

New York, Aug. 11 (AP)—Uncle Sam wants 125,000 dogs for his army, navy and coast guard.

Dogs for Defense, Inc., a New York City organization with branches in all parts of the country, was named the collecting agency by Major General Edmund B. Gregory of the quartermaster corps, who decided upon the expansion following good reports on the original sentry dogs.

Under the new setup the defense group will obtain the dogs and will turn them over to the Front Royal, Va., quartermaster depot where a corps of amateur and professional trainers will school them in their military duties.

Untrained dogs as well as trained ones will be accepted. Almost all the restrictions specified by General Gregory are that the dogs be between one and five years old, stand 18 inches high at the shoulder and be neither gun nor storm shy.

At the Virginia camp the dogs will be segregated according to the type of work for which they are best fitted and then sent to the various services.

With the armed forces they will be used as sentry aids, messengers and in similar capacities. Some, however, might find use as watch dogs at defense plants.

## Guilty Verdict Against Aroff

San Francisco, Aug. 11 (AP)—A general court-martial's findings in the case of Lieut. Maurice N. Aroff, first naval officer to face such trial in World War II, were prepared today for submission to Secretary of Navy Frank Knox.

The court-martial's outcome was not announced but on the basis of naval procedure there was no alternative except to presume that Aroff had been found guilty on the four counts charged—scandalous conduct, conduct to the prejudice of good order and discipline, violation of a lawful regulation, and falsehood.

Charges were based on the navy's contention Aroff accepted an automobile from Actor Tony Martin for facilitating his enlistment as a chef specialist; gave false replies when questioned about the car, accepted gifts of cuff links from two engineers commissioned through his office, and allowed enlistment of men outside the 12th naval district.

Naval regulations state that "if the court is cleared and not reopened, you may assume guilt on all charges." This was the case yesterday at conclusion of the two-week trial. After review in Washington, the court's decision as to guilt and sentence will be announced.

Aroff faces maximum penalty of 15 years at hard labor at Portsmouth naval prison. Other possible penalties are dismissal from the service, reduction in rank through loss of promotion numbers, or a public reprimand.
