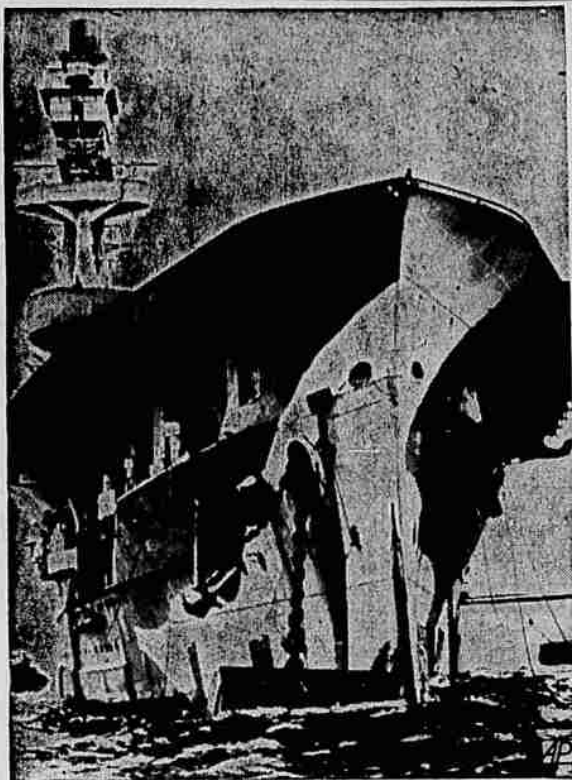

Oiling of South River Rd. Asked For 3 Miles

E. L. Gray, coordinator for the city of Independence, requested the county court today to authorize the laying of a coat of light oil over the south river road from the last Oregon Electric undercrossing to the Independence ferry, stating that dust conditions there are very bad and when hop picking starts will become even worse. The oil would only serve for the few weeks of hop picking, it was stated, and he suggested that the court go ahead and place a heavy paved coat later in the year. The distance is about three miles.

Court members indicated if they put on the light coat of oil requested for this road it will mean that similar service would have to be extended to a large mileage of roads elsewhere suffering in the same manner. The county never has placed any light oil coats on roads, said court members, and whatever has been done in that direction has been done by property owners adjacent to roads affected.

As to placing a heavier bled pavement later in the year it was indicated that this was out, not only from impossibility of securing the oil but also the fact that no help would be available for the oiling crew which is now pretty well broken up.

While the court did not state it would not place the light oil dressing on the road as requested it indicated it was doubtful if the request would be granted. Further investigation will be made.

The foreman of Roberts hop

yard was also before the court this morning asking permission to place a light oil dressing at the yard's expense on the short stretch of road near the yard on the new fill which remains unpaved. The court plans to pave this small portion with heavy oil if it can secure the oil. Oil men in Portland advised the court today there is not a drop of asphalt in storage there and the only place it can be secured is from California, although no assurances were given it would even be available from there. The court will be advised a little later as to whether it will be possible to get this type of oil

sage to the house, that the measure provided that commissioned officers on the survey's active list "shall be deemed to be in active military service." He said he was informed that under this provision, all active commissioned service men in the survey, whether in time of war or peace, would be eligible for benefits to which military personnel and dependents are entitled. It would be different, the president said, if a majority of the survey's functions were clearly military or naval. "On the contrary, in time of

peace," he said, "its duties and functions are normally civilian; and in time of war, most of them continue to be civilian."

The president added that under existing law, survey officers under military or naval command are entitled to benefits applying to the armed force.

Seattle's Gift Plane Battles with Japs

Somewhere in the Southwest Pacific, Aug. 13 (AP)—The flying fortress purchased for the army air force by residents of Seattle, Wash., has gone into action against the Japanese and returned unscathed except for a minor wing scar.

The big four-motored bomber with the inscription "Chief Seattle from the Pacific Northwest" painted on each side, roared into action against the enemy for the first time over the steaming jungles of New Guinea.

There isn't a man from Seattle among the two veteran crews that alternate at flying the fortress, but when I saw the ship at a New Guinea airfield Cadet Charles B. Cathey of (4527 18th Northwest) Seattle, was looking it over, too, admiring the gift of his home town folk.

Sgt. Meyer Levin of Brooklyn, who was bombardier for the late Capt. Collin Kelly when he sank the Japanese battleship Haruna in the first days of the war, is one of the men manning the Seattle ship.

The plane had just returned from a long and successful reconnaissance mission when I arrived at the field and the men who comprised the crew on that flight were just piling out and preparing to make their official report.

First Lieut. Morris Friedman of Grand Forks, N.D., a Philippine veteran, was the pilot. Other crewmen were Second Lieut. John Pickering of Flint, Mich.; Second Lieut. Haskett Wexler, of Chicago; Sgt. Leslie Stewart, East Chicago; Pvt. Philip Zumwalt, Nebo, Ill.; Radioman Sgt. Quentin Bakely, Idaho Falls, Ida.; Sgt. Dennis Craig, Boston; Thomas Wood, Hazelton, Ida., and Levin.

Levin, who has been on flying fortress assignment for more than a year, believes the United States bomb sight must be the finest in the world but said thorough training in its use is necessary before the bombardier becomes proficient with it.

Bank Donates Bronze, Brass

Approximately one ton of bronze and brass, some of which is of antique authority and nearly three fourths of a century old, will be presented A. C. Haag, Marion county salvage committee chairman, by employees of the Ladd & Bush Salem Branch of the U.S. National bank at 4 o'clock this afternoon.

So valuable is the contribution to the war effort that it will not be placed with other salvage, but kept in a separate place under lock and key until disposed of.

The "scrap" consists of many of the original fixtures in the bank and known to be 73 years old, the accumulation of years. A pictorial record of the transaction will be included in the historical files of the bank and also sent to financial publications.
