Strike at Alton Powder Plant
Alton, Ill., Sept. 8 (AP)—The day shift at the Smokeless Powder Division of the Western Cartridge Co., went on strike today when the company refused to reinstate Francis Bunzy, union president, who was discharged for what the company termed "subversive activities." The strike, called by the Chemical Workers' Union, Local 20024, was not authorized by the American Federation of Labor, but AFL leaders after the walkout said they would support the workers and demand the war department take over operation of the plant. A company spokesman said about 200 workers were employed in the department and that some, although not a majority, reported for work. The union said about 600 men were affected. The walkout climaxed a long dispute between the union and the company. Several government housing projects are being constructed in Venezuela.

Survey of Fuel Needs Due Here

Oregon's survey of fuel needs for the coming winter to be conducted by the state's war price and rationing boards, including those at Salem, Albany, Corvallis and McMinnville, will open tomorrow and continue through the rest of the week. Registration of fuel users, purely voluntary, in Salem will be carried on at the war price and rationing office on the second floor of the city hall, according to John Vaughn, executive secretary. The purpose of the registration is to determine the fuel needs of the state for the coming winter and blanks are provided for consumers to specify the type of fuel they use, amount on hand or on order, their anticipated needs, type of heating equipment and whether or not it can be converted to use other fuels. "It should be clearly understood by those registering that the act of registering does not assure them of a fuel supply," said Vaughn. "They must still place their orders with their dealers in the regular way." Industrial and commercial, as well as domestic fuel users are requested to register.
