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Canyon Creek Slide Closes Transit Pipes

Dallas—A slide below the mouth of Canyon creek which crushed 27 feet of 12-inch transit pipe, caused Dallas' two city reservoirs to go completely dry Wednesday.

A dangerous drop was noted Monday in the city reservoirs and a crew sent to the intake to investigate. When they found the intake clogged, they thought they had located the trouble. However after cleaning it out, the reservoir condition failed to improve. Later, W. L. Soehren, manager of the city water commission, found the slide on the bluff that had taken out the main and destroyed the transit pipe. This pipe had been re-laid last summer and buried four feet deep. The slide was heavy enough to crush the pipe.

Soehren secured from the Salem Sand & Gravel company, a power shovel, and set a crew of men to work immediately.

About 200 cubic yards of earth had to be moved to reach the pipe line. By the time the break was repaired and the water started through again, both reservoirs were completely dry. Late Wednesday afternoon the supply began to build up.

Residents are warned by Soehren to boil drinking water for a few days as contamination of the supply may have resulted when the pipe was broken. Chlorination of the water will be made, but until the water has had time to clear from the mains, boiling is an advisable precaution.

Silverton New Year Sees Vacant Store

Silverton—The beginning of the New Year in Silverton is marked by the many empty business buildings in the close-in trade section of town, although all merchants and the restaurants report the briskest sale in many years with more money apparent and people more definite as to their purchases.

Two local stores, the J. C. Penney company and the Safeway, are occupying fine new homes, leaving their former locations vacant.

The business, oldest in term of years, to discontinue is the E. H. Banks grocery, in partnership for many years with the late Frank Syring, and here for more than 20 years. Others that have moved to new locations are Peggy's Beauty Shop, Eleanor Melund's Blue Bird Beauty Shop, the M & S freight, the George Anderson barber shop and Elmer Johnson opening in the former Rudd Benson grocery.

The reason given for many discontinuing in business was the difficulty in obtaining material for their shelves and the rationing rules entailing continued extra bookkeeping with no help available.

The nearness to the Portland shipyards to Silverton is an attraction to the workers to make the trip daily with their families having the advantage of living in a small town. Several buses and individually owned cars are driven between Silverton and Portland for each work shift.
