Rationing Dates

Ration Book No. 3
Brown stamps for purchase of meats, fats, etc.
January 20 expiration date of brown stamps R, T and U. Each weekly series good for 16 points.
February 26, 1944, expiration date of brown V, W and X. V series valid January 21 to January 26, and X on February 6.
Ration Book No. 1
Processed fruits and vegetables, jams and jellies.
January 20, 1944, expiration date of green stamps D, E and F. Green stamps O, H and J valid January 1 to February 26.
Sugar
March 31, 1944, expiration date of stamp 30 in Book 4, good for 8 pounds.
Shoes
Stamp No. 1, Book 1, and "Airplane" stamp No. 1, Book 3, valid for one pair each for indefinite period. Loose stamps not accepted.
Stoves
Purchase certificates available at local ration boards.
Wood, Sawdust, Coal
Fuel dealers deliver by priorities based on needs.
Fuel Oil
February 4, 1944, expiration date of period 2 fuel oil coupons.
March 14, 1944, expiration date of period 3 coupons.
Gasoline
January 21, 1944, expiration date of No. 3 stamps in a book, each good for 3 gallons. March 21, 1944, expiration date of No. 10 stamps, valid January 22.
Value of Gasoline Coupons:
A, B1, C1, 3 gallons; B2, C2, H and T, 5 gallons; D, 1.5 gallons; E, 1 gallon.
Tire Inspection
Cars with a ration book must have tires inspected every 4 months; B books every 4 months; C books every 3 months. Commercial motor vehicles every 6 months or 8,000 miles, whichever comes first.
