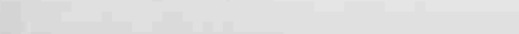

Rationing Dates

Processed Foods—(On September 17 all point values to be removed except for canned fruits, canned juices, canned tomatoes, catsup and chili sauce. Book 4 stamps AS through 23 and AS through 15 valid indefinitely. Blue tokens to be distributed October 1 and accepted only in multiples of 10 between September 17-30. Retailers will not give in change after September 17. Use all you have before October 1.

Meat, Butter, Cheese: Book 4—Red stamps AS through 23 and AS through 15 valid indefinitely. Spare stamp 23 good for 10 points valid only through October 31.

Sugar: Book 4—Sugar stamps 3, 31, 32, 33 valid indefinitely. 5 points each. Sugar stamp 40 valid through February 22, 1945, for 5 pounds home canning only. For more canning sugar, apply local board under spare stamp 37.

Shoe: Local Stamp Invald. Book 3—Avalanche stamps 1 and 2 valid indefinitely.

Gasoline Coupons—Not valid unless endorsed. "A" No. 12 valid through Sept. 21. "A" No. 13 valid Sept. 22. Apply by mail to local boards at once for renewal, attaching back cover of "A" book, and use inspection record. Bikes available at service stations.

Stoves (Rationing of coal and wood heating and cooking under 1 and October 15). Apply at local OPA board for purchase certificate.

Wood, Coal, Sawdust—Deliver by private haulers based on written statement of needs.

Fuel Oil—Period 15 stamps valid thru September 30. New period 1 coupons valid now.

Price Control—Report overcharges to price clerk at local OPA board.

Rent Control—Petitions now being received in all area rent offices under "petitions districts" agency endorsement.
