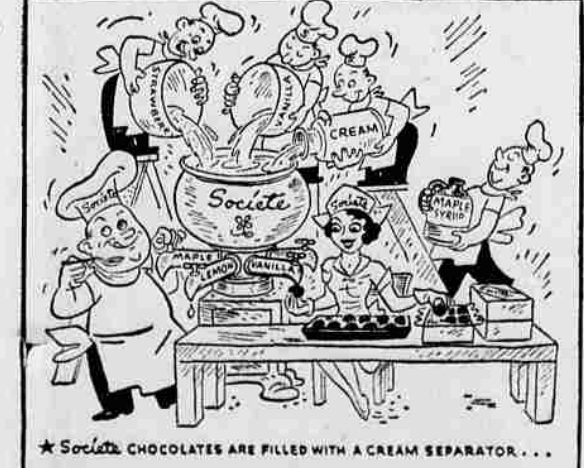

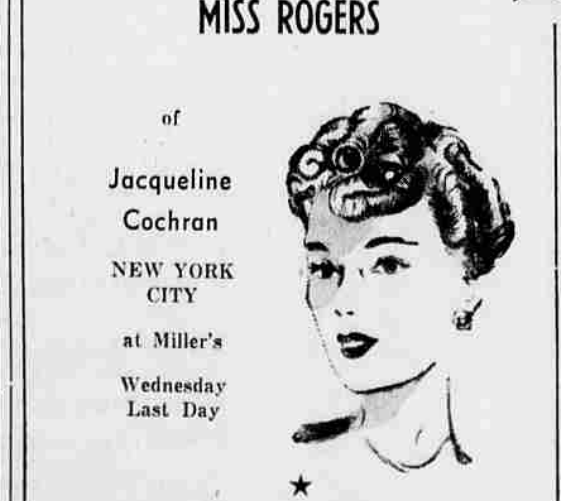

The next meeting will be held at the home of Mrs. Wedell in December and will be in the nature of a Christmas party.

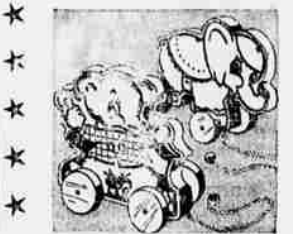
