Fire District Petitions Filed

Albany—Numerous signed petitions were presented to the Linn county court asking that it create a rural fire protection district encompassing an area of about 100 square miles centering at Scio.

The proposed district extends southward to a point two miles north of Lacombe, to Brewster, and to and including Crabtree, and is bounded on the west and north by the North Santiam river.

The court has taken the petition under consideration with expectation of calling for an election at which directors will be elected and a tax levy authorized, unless a remonstrance bearing names of 25 percent or more affected property owners should appear, in which case it would be necessary to hold an election to determine whether or not the district shall be formed.

He opened the Cascade Bakery company business in 1930 and served as president of The Dalles Kiwanis club and the Chamber of Commerce. He supplied as minister of The Dalles Seventh Day Adventist church when it was begun.

Surviving are his widow, Olive; three sons and one daughter, Capt. Ray N. Foster, with Patton's army in Europe; Charles E., with the U. S. navy, Ster-
