Linn Sawmill Is Electrified

Lebanon — The McPherson Lumber company sawmill, now being rebuilt after having been partially destroyed by fire on the night of April 3, will be all electrically operated instead of steam powered, stated Joe McPherson who, with his mother, Mrs. Addie McPherson, owns the mill.

Reconstruction of the plant is going ahead very well and if there is no interference it should be ready to operate some time in August, McPherson said.

The new structure is expected to employ about the same crew and its production will be about the same, about 25,000 board feet daily. There were up to 23 employed at the time of the fire, but rearrangements may reduce the required number to about 20.

Principal change in the plant will be the conversion to an all electric plant, rather than steam and thus eliminating the furnace and boilers.
