Week Remains For Petitions

Just a week remains for the completion of referendum petitions on measures of the last legislature. It was warned by officials of the elections division of the state department here today.

Only two petitions are circulating at present, and it appears that both will be completed before June 15, the last day when they may be submitted to bring the measures to a vote of the people in November, 1946.

One of the petitions seeks to refer a bill creating the office of registrar of elections in Multnomah county, while the other is concerned with a bill closing certain coastal streams to commercial fishing for parts of the year.

A total of 14,442 signatures are necessary on the petitions. One other petition, to refer one of the milk control bills of the legislative session, was abandoned recently when it appeared that the requisite number of signatures could not be obtained in the time allowed.

Exemption Advice To Mine Claimants

According to the state department of geology and mineral industries, assessment work on mining claims was exempted for the duration of the war by act of congress, approved May 3, 1943.

In order to take advantage of this act, a claimant of a mining claim must file or cause to be filed with the county recorder of the county in which the claim is located, a notice of his desire to hold the claim under the act, before noon of July 1 of each year that the act remains in effect.

No limit is set on the number of claims which may be exempted. These notices should be filed with the county recorder before July 1, 1945.

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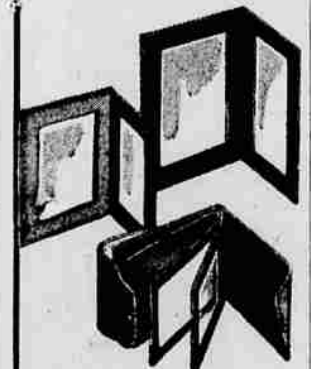


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Monmouth to Present Rodeo

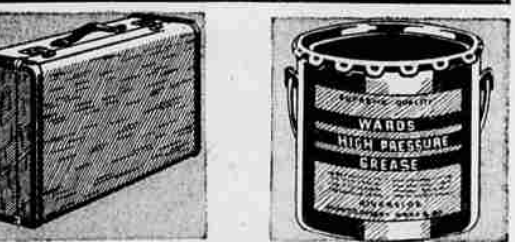
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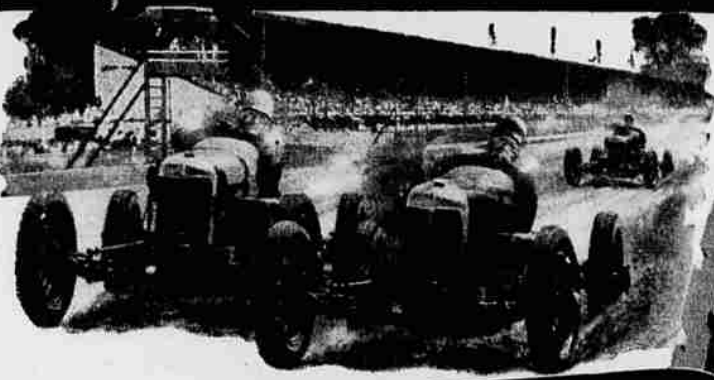
