

Mercy Workers Hold Luncheon

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Permits Are Needed For Forest Entry

Lebanon — By proclamation of Gov. Earl Snell, virtually all forest lands under the jurisdiction of the Linn county fire patrol will be closed, due to extreme fire hazard, beginning next Wednesday, July 11, according to Wayne Downing, district warden.

Permits are not required, however, for travel along four rivers, namely, the Quartzville fork of the Santiam to the forest service boundary; the Cascadia Santiam fork to the boundary, the Calapooya to Dollar's camp, and Wiley creek to the work of the Little and Big Wiley creeks. Nor does the order apply to the Cascadia camp grounds.

Permits may be obtained at the fire patrol headquarters, Gates side camp, Thomas patrol station, Crabtree guard station, Sweet Home guard station, Cosgrove ranch at Foster, Cascadia fire patrol station, Courtney creek fire patrol station, DeArmond fire patrol station and at Audy Ayer, LaComb.

Sublimity — The Sublimity post office, one of the oldest in the state, has passed from fourth to third class. Mrs. Clara Neal has been notified. When she was appointed postmaster three years ago, stamp receipts amounted to \$1,554.66. Within the last year the receipts have increased to \$2,081.99.

Local historians report that in pioneer days the Sublimity office was on the regular route from Oregon City to California. It was established on September 29, 1852. James W. Denny, first postmaster, chose the name Sublimity because of the "sublime" scenery in the hills surrounding the city.

Some of the early postmasters were John A. Ditter, E. McKenzie, Mrs. H. H. LaCroix and B. Prang.

West Salem School Budget Provides Building Project

West Salem, July 11—The school's annual budget providing \$26,625 for operational expenditures for the fiscal year between July 1, 1945, and June 30, 1946, and \$2000 for the post-war building fund, levied last year for a five-year period, was approved last evening at a budget meeting held at the schoolhouse. Nineteen thousand of the total represents funds for instruction while the textbook fund was higher than usual due to a law requiring the change of texts in the upper grades.

Following the budget meeting the board met with Pete Harms, the new chairman, presiding. Mrs. Verne Axelson, newly appointed clerk, and Thomas Dalke, re-elected director, took the oath of office.

Mrs. Evelyn Shultz and Mrs. Bessie Belt were elected as instructors and Mrs. L. B. McClelland accepted her contract, completing the staff for the ensuing term. Mrs. Schultz of Sherman Oaks, Calif., will teach in the upper grades while Mrs. Belt of this city will be assigned to a place in the lower grades. The meeting was adjourned until the first meeting in August.
