

Bergman in Dowling's Place

L. P. Bergman, well-known express official, has been appointed general manager of the Pacific department of the Railway Express Agency, succeeding the late J. J. Dowling, it has been announced by H. E. Brown, local agent of the company.

During his 45 years in express service, Mr. Bergman has held many key positions throughout the west and middle west. Starting as an office boy in Kansas City, Mo., in July, 1900, he spent some years as assistant to the operating officials in various cities and after July, 1918, was operating superintendent at Great Falls, Mont., El Paso, and Los Angeles, Calif., being in charge of the city division in Los Angeles for nearly 10 years.

Mr. Bergman was assigned to the mid-west territory as general manager at Kansas City, Mo., in June, 1936, and later spent several years as general manager, department of personnel, San Francisco.

The Pacific area in which Mr. Bergman now directs express affairs is the largest in the operating organization of the ex-

press agency. It embraces express business handled all along the Pacific coast and as far east as El Paso, as well as operations in Alaska and the Hawaiian Islands. Nearly 10 percent of the 290,000,000 shipments handled by the express agency in 1944 originated in the Pacific area.

The only survivor is a son, Oscar Gingrich, Jr., of the U.S. navy, stationed at Portsmouth, Me., who will be unable to attend the services.

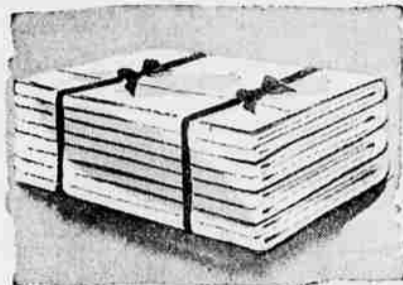
