## Dallas Theater Interests Sold

Dallas — Lynn McDaniels of Klamath Falls assumed management of the Majestic and Rio theatres this week for Jesse Jones of Portland, whose purchase of the two theatres from George Gould and Mrs. Irene Adam was announced this week.

McDaniels, recently discharged from the army after having served a period of five years with the second armored division in France, was for the past year hospitalized at Barnes hospital in Vancouver, Wash., recovering from a leg wound. Prior to entering the service, he had been employed in theatres in Klamath Falls. His wife and daughter, now in Vancouver, will move to Dallas later.

The Majestic theatre, operated by the late George Gould, Sr., for 20 years, was owned and managed since his death three years ago by his daughter and son, Mrs. Irene Adam and George Gould, Jr., who started the Rio four years ago.

Mrs. Adam will assist the new manager for a few weeks after which she plans to take a rest. Gould plans to leave Dallas.

Jones, theatre purchaser, is an independent theatre operator, with two theatres in suburban Portland. He will continue the present plan of operating the Rio from Thursday through Saturday and maintain the daily schedule with Sunday matinee at the Majestic.
