Polk Sheriff Office Busy

Dallas — One hundred and forty-seven persons were lodged in the Polk county jail during 1945, according to Deputy Sheriff Tony Neufeldt. The number exceeds by three those imprisoned in 1944 and is 14 less than the 161 total of 1943.

Over one-third of those held in jail during the past year had been arrested for drunkenness. The number of arrests with specific charges follows: Drunkenness, 58; grand larceny, 18; petty larceny, 15; vagrancy, 6; drunken driving, 6; obtaining money under false pretenses, 7; runaways, 5; violations of parole, 4; arrested for other counties, 4; reckless driving, 3; after hours, 3; assault with a dangerous weapon, 2; AWOL servicemen, 2; negligent homicide, 1; non-support, 1; hit and run driving, 1; trespassing, 1; contributing to the delinquency of a minor, 1.
