

Four-Year Report Shows Red Cross Chapter's Service

Further excerpts from the four-year report of Marion county chapter, American Red Cross, bring forth more interesting statistics and records as the chapter makes way for the fund campaign opening on March 1 and the start of a new year. In a previous article the blood bank and disaster committee's work were discussed. Today the Junior Red Cross, first-aid division, life-saving work, and nutrition department are featured.

Junior Red Cross members in Marion county have made 31,217 articles from the start of 1942 until the close of 1945, the past year's report showing 6,705 articles. Junior Red Cross is an enrollment of service, not of money-raising. It is an educational program, open to all school children, from the grades on through senior high school. It is a means of acquainting young people with Red Cross and its program of service, so that when they become adult leaders they know "what Red Cross is all about."

Projects for Youth

At the same time, the program provides many projects for the school youngsters to give community service. This past year Junior Red Cross members have supplied and sent out many educational boxes for children in other countries, these boxes including not only educational items, but such things as bars of soap or other such simple necessities that are hard to obtain in the war-torn countries.

Also, the Junior Red Cross here supplied hundreds of Christmas cards for the men at the U. S. naval hospital, Corvallis, the patients thus being supplied with cards to send to their families and friends. Right now, one unit of Junior Red Cross here is making certain articles of clothing needed by children in war-devastated countries. Mrs. Carmalite Weddle is county Junior Red Cross chairman now.

A standing program promoted by Red Cross is that for first aid, water-safety, life saving and accident prevention.

Volunteers Certified

Through 1942, 1943, 1944 and 1945, a total of 7075 persons were certified in first-aid by this chapter, the report showing also that 87 volunteer instructors were certified and 21 first-aid squads organized. Mrs. Gordon Black headed this work through much of the war period, and Wayne Kuhl is the present first-aid chairman, serving the past year.

Up to the end of 1945, through four years, 710 persons were certified here in life-saving, the report reveals. Hollis Huntington is chairman of this division for the county Red Cross chapter.

Although stressed especially in war times as essential because of shortages and rationing, nutrition is a subject just as essential in peace-times as in war, many homes ever needing guidance in securing balanced
