Canadian Logs Fast Vanishing

Dwindling newsprint supplies were threatened further today with announcement that 50,000 lumber workers in five Pacific northwest states may join strikers of the two Salem posts, with Ora Furlough and Mona Waring serving as chairmen.

ing Canadian woodworkers in demands for wage increases. As newspaper publishers in British Columbia and the western United States planned to reduce the size of their editions to meet the emergency, log supplies in Canadian mills approached the vanishing point. Latest developments in the lumber scene were:
1. At Portland, Ore., the International Woodworkers of America, CIO, was to resume negotiations with operators for a 12 1/2-cent hourly wage boost.
2. The strike of 37,000 mem-

bers of the Canadian International Woodworkers of America, CIO, moved into its eighth day with no appreciable change. A union spokesman said 33 small firms employing about 1,000 men had met the union's demands.
3. In Victoria, B. C., it was reported that the provincial government may announce a settlement proposal later this week. The government reportedly was considering appointing a regional board to set hours and wages for the Canadian lumber industry or appointing a mediator

whose decision would be binding.
4. The Seattle Daily Times announced a reduction in the size of its paper during the emergency, with advertising bearing the brunt of the cut. The Richmond, Calif., Independent will reduce the size of its edition from 22 pages to 12 effective this week. Display advertising space was cut 75 percent.
